WASHINGTON, Dec. 20. Lord Riddell, who has been serving as a personal officer between the British

delegation and United States and foreign press representatives during the progress of the arms conference, has arranged to sail from New York Thursday on the steamer Orbita. He had planned to depart a week ago to attend to personal and pressing business en-

gagements in Europe but was induced by Mr. Lloyd George to remain longer in Washington upon the urgent request of the British delegation which regarded his services of highest value.

GEORGETOWN. Schooner Charlotte M. Capt. Fitzgerald arrived in port with a load of Picton coal for the J. J. Hughes Co. of Georgetown. While in Picton harbor awaiting a favorable chance to sail, what might have been a very serious accident occurred. One of the four men complained of a cold and put on extra fire in the stoke hold stove in the forecastle before going to bed. In the morning the captain went on deck returning to the cabin he fell and hit his head. One was rendered unconscious. One of the crew called his companions in the forecastle and although they answered, failed to appear on deck. When they ran out the Captain who had recovered consciousness went to the forecastle and found the other two members of the crew in an unconscious condition. The Marine Police was instantly summoned and ordered McLean sent to the hospital where he is recovering steadily. The other members of the crew have suffered no after effects. The rescue of the accident was gas escaping from the stove. This gas found its way back to the Captain's cabin and caused what nearly proved to be a fatal accident.

IN MEMORIAM

LATE MR. DONALD M. SIMPSON. The death of Mr. Donald M. Simpson which occurred on Dec. 18th, 1921, proved one of the outstanding losses to the community in which he lived.
