PRINCE LOUIS NAPOLEON.

France has now retained the republican form of Government for thirty years, which is the longest term of continuity within a century past, and confidence in the stability of national institutions usually grows with their age. The recent alleged discovery of a plot to restore the Empire with the time for another coup d'etat near at hand, appears not to have caused serious or wide-spread alarm. Still the rapid and kaleidoscopic changes that have occurred within a century suggest the possibility of other revolutions yet to come.

There are indeed but few indications of a desire among the French people outside of Paris for a restoration of the Empire. The great humiliation suffered by the nation at Sedan is yet fresh in the memories of the people. The last Emperor brought France to the verge of destruction. The Republic restored her self-respect and brought her again to prominence among the nations. Peace has done much to bring back her former prosperity. It is hardly in times like these that a soldier prince of the house of Napoleon would be likely to be called for as a leader by the masses of the French people. It must be later than September next, and under greatly changed conditions that Prince Louis Napoleon can succeed, if at all.

Prince Louis Napoleon, as he is called, is thirty seven years of age and the second son of Prince Jerome Bonaparte, (Eliopon) and the Princess Clothilda. He is a fine soldier, a colonel in the Russian army, and is said to bear a strong facial resemblance to Napoleon III. When the Napoleonic Princes were banished for political reasons he entered the service of the King of Italy and later, on invitation of the late Czar joined the Russian service. He stands high in Imperial favor at St. Petersburg, and reports say that he is shortly to be made a general. The close friendship between the governments of Russia and France in recent years has doubtless done something to enhance the prestige of Prince Louis.

Some years ago Prince Louis succeeded his brother Prince Victor, by the will of the majority of the Imperialist party as the aspirant to the throne of France. He is said to be also in a marked degree acceptable to the Royalists, and enjoys a good measure of personal popularity among the people. These conditions make him easily the most formidable of the Pretenders. France is now republican, no doubt, but the time may come when in a national crisis a soldier leader will be called for, and Prince Louis, being yet young, has time to wait. His conservative temperament is not likely to permit him to strike before the time is ripe.
