This has been a year of good pasture and good crops in Prince Edward Island, better in that regard than in New Brunswick or Nova Scotia.

SOME PERTINENT QUESTIONS

It costs more than twice as much as it did twelve years ago to govern Canada and provide for its public services.

There are not nearly twice as many people in the country as there were in 1896. There are probably a million more now than there were then.

A great deal of money has been spent to bring immigrants to Canada in the past few years, and many have come, but nearly all of them have gone to the Northwest.

What has been done by the Government to make known in the United Kingdom and Europe the attractions of these Eastern Provinces to immigrant settlers?

The Northwest has been extensively advertised at great cost. Advertising is a powerful means of booming a country or a city.

We are losing thousands of our people who go west year after year, and not this in part at least the result of public money contributed by all the country but expended to build up one section at the expense of the others.

Now many millions more are to be paid by Canada, of which we must contribute equally with the rest of the Canadian people, to build and equip a railway to Hudson Bay and a steamship route to Europe that way.

Is it fair to Prince Edward Island

that we should be forced to contribute to this work while our own winter communications are neglected as they have been?

The Northwest people have a number of railway outlets to the States and to Eastern Canada, always open. We have no railway outlet and in winter our steamer connection is cut off.

The Canadian Government is bound by solemn treaty to provide efficient communication by steam with the mainland summer and winter.

We are paying and have long been paying three short-haul rates in shipping our products abroad.

Is this just? Is it to be always tolerated? Shall we for party's sake shout ourselves hoarse for the Hudson Bay Route while our transportation grievances remain unredressed?

These seem to The Guardian to be timely and pertinent questions. Who will answer them?
