SUSPECTED SPY CAUGHT IN TOILS

NEW YORK, March 17.—In Wilhelm Korehaus, arrested here two weeks ago on a Presidential warrant, and confined today in the Tombs as a dangerous enemy alien, pending a final disposition of his case, federal officials said tonight they believed they had found an agent sent to this country from Brazil in 1914 by the German government.

At the time of his arrest, it was learned tonight, Korehaus was occupying an apartment in this city overlooking the Hudson river, where American craft were accustomed to anchor. Powerful field glasses and three cameras were found in the apartment, it was said, and the authorities were informed that he had displayed great anger when a maid entered his room suddenly and found him arranging pictures he was credited with taking. When he was arrested, however, no pictures were found in his effects.
