ROUGH ON JACK JOHNSON.

WASHINGTON, December 11.—A denunciation of the legal procedure under which a brown-hued, black-

skinned, thick-lipped, brutal-hearted African can walk into the office of the law and demand an edict, guaranteeing him legal wedlock to a white woman, was one of the many sensational features of a speech in the house today by Representative Roddenberry of Georgia in favor of a resolution he had introduced earlier to prohibit inter-marriage of whites and negroes. The measure, a direct result of the recent marriage of Jack Johnson, the negro pugilist, with a white girl, did not get to a vote but it enlivened a dull day's proceeding.

GARDNER SAID TO BE ON WAY BACK FROM WEST.

MONTREAL, December 11.—That Jimmy Gardner, who left for the west only a couple of weeks ago, is either already on his way back east or will start east shortly, is reported in hockey circles today. Some dissatisfaction is said to have arisen in the British Columbia league over the

allotment of players, and Gardner is said to have fallen out with the Patriots on the matter.

If Gardner does come back there will be no difficulty put in his way in signing up with one of the N. H. A. teams.

MONTREAL CAPITALISTS AFTER MARITIME REAL ESTATE.

ST. JOHN, December 11.—R. Bedard and W. F. Murphy, representing a syndicate of French-Canadian capitalists in Montreal, buying residential properties in the maritime provinces, have been in the city the last two days quietly looking over the ground. Tonight they left for Halifax and it is their intention to stop in Moncton on the way back. That the development of the maritime provinces is to commence in earnest now is the opinion of both gentlemen.

A SCHOOLMASTER'S MISTAKE CAUSED SOME EXCITEMENT

NANCY, France, December 11.—A repetition of the mobilization incident of November 26, when the reservists in the district of Arracourt were called out, occurred yesterday through the misunderstanding of a telephone message by a schoolmaster at the village of Cruses, on the Lorraine frontier.

The schoolmaster mistook the order directing the periodical mobilization of the members of the customs service, the gendarmes and other officials for practise, for a general mobilization order. He opened the envelope containing secret instructions, and sounded the tocsin.

CHARLES H. HYDE GETS SENTENCE OF THREE YEARS

NEW YORK, Dec. 11.—Charles H. Hyde, former city chamberlain, a native of Truro, N. S., convicted of bribery in connection with the manipulation of city funds, was sentenced by Justice Goff today to serve not more than three years, and six months, and not less than two years in state's prison.

The justice, however, granted a certificate of reasonable doubt, and issued a stay of execution, agreeing to admit the prisoner to \$25,000 bail, pending argument of his appeal.

WINNIPEG SCHOOL MATTER.

WINNIPEG, Dec. 11.—At a regular meeting of the school board a delegation representing the Catholic rate payers of the city will present a petition praying the city to take over the Catholic private schools and employ qualified teachers under the requirements of the public school act and operate them under the act.

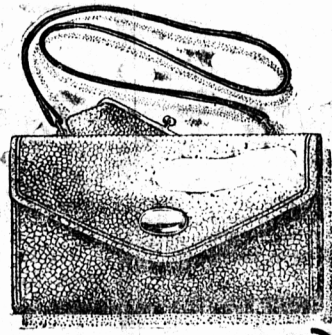
