War Situation Last Night

Have the Allies launched the biggest offensive in history in the midst of a supply shortage? If taken at face value, two items of news might give that impression. Six armies of thousands of men and tens of thousands of heavy weapons are attacking the strongly-fortified western border of Germany. Military leaders announce they have been expending 35 days' supply of ammunition in 10 days. The answer apparently is something like this: Even though the recent and current rate of supply expenditure at the front is well in excess of receipts, a stockpile has been built up in the European theatre of operations sufficient to make possible the offensive.

Big Winter Drive By Red Army Predicted

LONDON, Nov. 19 (AP) — Russian troops in a six-mile push beyond the severed Budapest-Miskolc railway, today captured the important communications centre of Gyonyos, 40 miles northeast of the Hungarian capital and only 23 miles south of the old Czechoslovak border, Moscow announced tonight.

Canadians Thanked For Oversubscribing Seventh Victory Loan

OTTAWA, Nov. 19 (CP) — Prime Minister Mackenzie King, Finance Minister Ilesley and Graham Towers, General Chairman of the War Finance Committee, tonight broadcast their thanks to the people of Canada for subscribing more than \$1,500,000,000 to the Seventh Victory Loan. In speeches prepared for delivery during a 15-minute broadcast over the national networks of the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, the speakers said that during the Seventh Loan's three-week campaign for \$1,500,000,000 Canadians had subscribed possibly as much as \$1,510,000,000. The campaign closed a week ago and on the basis of preliminary statistics subscriptions now totaled \$1,509,000,000.
