Recent Mixup In Boxing Decision May Lead To Another Drastic Ruling

(By Edward J. Neil, Associated Press Sports Writer) NEW YORK, Jan. 28.—All sorts of remedies, ranging from pills to plasters, were suggested today for the worst headache boxing has suffered here in years—consistent bad officiating.

As a result of the boxing commission's reversal at the Madison Square Garden ringside Friday night, of a decision originally awarded to Babe Risko over Vince Dundee, all hands have been summoned to a clinic in the commission offices today. Out of the melee may come a new ruling, drastic as the stand Postmaster General James A. Farley took four years ago, when, as head of the commission, he passed a "no four" rule to end an epidemic of low blows.

The more rabid today were for passing a "no commission" rule, automatically voiding General John L. Phelan, chairman, Bill Brown and D. Ross Successfully Defends Junior Welterweight Title

By Paul Mickelson Associated Press Sports Writer (By Guardian's Special Wire) MIAMI Fla., Jan. 28.—Barney Ross of Chicago easily defended his junior welterweight boxing championship at Miami Municipal Stadium tonight by winning a 10-round decision over Frankie Klock, San Francisco challenger.

From the second round, when the champion floored the challenger for a count of eight with a hard right to the jaw, the result was in little doubt. Ross was the unanimous choice of the two judges. On the Associated Press score sheet, the champion won eight rounds, lost one and held the challenger even in another.

A crowd of 13,000 paid an estimated total of \$35,000 to watch the battle. Klock was willing enough and gave the crowd his money's worth in lively exchanges with the junior welterweight and lightweight king, but each time he gained an advantage, Barney slowed him up with a series of rights and rights that took the sting out of his punches.

The only round Klock won was the sixth when he nailed Barney with a series of rights and lefts that had the crowd in an uproar. But beyond that round and Ross' attack in the second, it was the old story of a hard battling but outclassed challenger vainly attempting to best a better man, who beat him in timing and ring tactics.

Ross weighed 136 and Klock 137. Buddy Bear, the heavyweight champion's young brother, scored a one-round knockout over Tommy Davenport, 199½ pounder from Little Rock, Ark. Buddy, weighing 236 pounds, knocked Davenport down four times with a series of wild swings before he stayed on the floor.

Max Baer and Jim Maloney, former heavyweight contender but now a Miami trainer, were through four rounds as King Levinsky, a knockout victim of the champion in another match that was never labelled an exhibition, looked sadly on. Levinsky, remembering what happened to Levinsky, merely held on, confining his "attack" to an occasional nudge of Max's ribs.
