MANY CHINESE KILLED IN QUAKE.

VICTORIA, B. C. June 11.—The steamer Shawmut brought news of a disastrous loss of life following an earthquake at Haiing Kiang. A telegram received at Tokio from Peking, shortly before the Shawmut sailed, reported that 4,000 persons were crushed to death as vast numbers of houses destroyed and many left starving. The empress dowager has telegraphed urgent instructions to the local governors to take measures to relieve the distress.
