CARVER COMMUTATION PETITION.

To His Excellency, the Right Honorable the Earl of Minto, G C M G, &c. &c. &c. Governor General of Canada.

May it please your Excellency—The petition of the undersigned citizens of Prince Edward Island, humbly sheweth:

That Joseph Carver, late of Township Number Forty Eight, in said Province, is now confined in the goal in Queen's County in this Province, under sentence of death for the murder of Alexander Stewart.

That said sentence was passed at the sitting of the Supreme Court held in Charlottetown in July last.

That the jury who found the said prisoner guilty at the same time strongly recommended him to mercy.

That your petitioners are familiar with the circumstances of the case and earnestly support said strong recommendation of the jury for mercy to the prisoner.

Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency would be pleased to commute the said sentence of death passed on said Joseph Carver, and to spare his life.
