CHICAGO, May 28—Egyptology Versus Health is the title of a monograph received at the headquarters of the Tuberculosis Institution of Chicago Friday in which it is alleged that the great spread of tuberculosis in Europe and America in the last 100 years found its causation in the disinterment and shipment broadcast, over the land of the mummies which had reposed so long in tombs of the Pharaohs.

The monograph was written by Dr. Raffaele Sorgnac, one of the lecturers at the Sorbonne in Paris, who was an interested visitor at the recent tuberculosis exhibit in this city.
