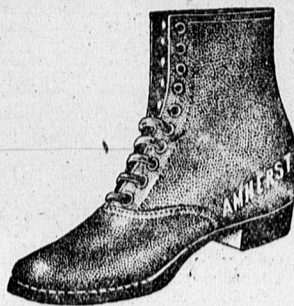

On the evening of the 16th. of this month the strange phenomenon will be witnessed of a red moon. This, at any rate, is the assertion of O. A. Crawford, a Montreal amateur astronomer. "The reason for this change of coloring is that the moon will be so nearly in line with the centre of the earth and the sun that it will pass into the great shadow of the earth. Instead of entirely disappearing in the shadow, as in ordinary eclipse, the moon will turn reddish or copper-colored. This will be the result of the refraction or bending of a portion of the sun's rays through the atmosphere of the earth, in the same manner as any article stuck into water appears to bend inward. On the 16th, in the evening, the rays of the sun, passing through the earth's atmosphere, will be refracted enough to strike the moon, and give it a reddish color.
