NEWFOUNDLAND MAY ADOPT CONSCRIPTION.

ST. JOHNS, N. F., Nov. 20.— Selective conscription may be adopted in Newfoundland as in Canada in order to maintain the strength of the colony's overseas forces, is the opinion of Government officials here. It was stated today that the stream of reinforcements which has sent six thousand men from the island to the fighting line in the past three years has virtually dried up notwithstanding a vigorous recruiting campaign and the colonial Government has been advised that the Newfoundland regiment which has figured conspicuously in official statements, both at Gallipoli and on the western front, must soon be withdrawn unless more men are forthcoming. Some speakers have set the number of men that should be raised at a thousand. It is pointed out that if there is a Union Government in the colony, the solution of the problem should be easy.

EAST KOOTENAY UNIONIST.

NELSON, B. C., Nov. 18.— Dr. S. Bonnell of Fernie, was last night nominated as Unionist candidate for East Kootenay at a Unionist convention at Cranbrook. Indications are that the Laurier Liberals will run a candidate.

SISTER MARY BASIL WINS SUIT IN KINGSTON.

KINGSTON, Ont., November 20.— Sister Mary Basil, who sued Archbishop Spratt and others for twenty-nine thousand dollars for assault and abduction, was awarded twenty-four thousand dollars by the jury before Mr. Justice Britton in court here Saturday night. Of this amount the Archbishop, the Roman Catholic Corporation, Mother General Frances Rekis and the Sisters of Charity are to pay twenty thousand dollars, and Dr. Daniel Phelan four thousand. The other defendant, Policeman Nayton, was assessed nothing. After the jury's finding had been announced, Mr. Lally McCarthy, K.C., for the defence, asked concerning the application he had made during the trial for a non-suit in the charges against the Archbishop, the Roman Catholic Corporation and the Sisters of Charity. His Lordship announced that he would reserve his decision on the application.

POPE'S RELATIVES MOVE FROM WAR ZONE.

ROME, Nov. 20.— Pope Benedict's mother and sister, who were at Treviso, have gone to Bologna because of fear of the Austro-German invasion.

NEW YORK WOMAN SAVED DESPATCHES FOR ENGLAND

LONDON, Nov. 21.— The name of an American woman, who it was related in a military court proceeding here on last Friday, saved some important British despatches from capture by Austrians when an Austrian submarine held up the steamer on which Captain Wilson was taken to Malta, by hiding them while men from the submarine searched the steamer, was revealed yesterday.

She is Mrs. E. Herbin, a widow of New York city. Captain Stanley Wilson, who was carrying the despatches and who himself was taken prisoner by the Austrians and only recently released, told the court that he threw one bag overboard but that to his horror it did not sink, as he had supposed it would. At this juncture he was approached by an American woman

traveling on the steamer who offered to take charge of the other bags, saying she wished to do something for England. "It was a great responsibility," said Captain Wilson, "but I took it and my action was justified, as the bags reached London." The bags were hidden by the American woman until the Austrians had concluded their search of the steamer.

MR. DONALD NICHOLSON'S SPEECH AT OPENING OF CAMPAIGN

MR. DONALD NICHOLSON

Mr. Donald Nicholson, who had a hearty reception, said: "It is not my intention to go deeply into politics this evening, the reasons for such a course are obvious. We are living in what may be termed, the knell of matter and the crush of worlds. Everything almost, is changing and conditions are being revolutionized throughout the whole universe. The minds and hearts of the people, I take it, are not so much upon the Election campaign, as they are upon the great war and what is happening today in Europe."

The third loan in April last was for \$150,000,000 in twenty-five year bonds, bearing the usual 5 per cent interest, but offered to the public at 96 per cent. Again a large over-subscription showed the patriotic determination of the people of Canada to back up the war, and their ability to do it. The new loan is offered only at par, namely one hundred cents on the dollar instead of at slight discount as the other loans were; but on the other hand the interest is to be 5-12 per cent, instead of 5 per cent. The enthusiastic manner in which these loans were taken up by the people, proves beyond the shadow of a doubt, not only that we are all determined to push the war to a successful close but also that, in spite of the criticisms that are so frequently offered, there is complete confidence in the Government's financial operations. Now, Mr. Chairman, Ladies and Gentlemen, the Government, in its wisdom, and having a greater knowledge of the awful conditions that are confronting the world, owing to the greatest struggle of all history, has thought fit to ask the leading Liberals of Canada to unite with them, and form a National, or what is known as a Union Government. Recently, Sir Thomas White, speaking at a public meeting in Leeds, Ontario, said that in this Union With-the-War Government, the women were to play a most important part in the future, and would naturally elevate and purify political life.

Ladies and Gentlemen, this is true, and in order to convince you of my friends' faith in the Canadian Government, I have no wish but to point out to you, that the strongest men on the Liberal side, with the exception of Sir Wilfrid Laurier himself, have entered this Government, actuated solely by the grim determination to sink their political feelings for the time being and to join with Sir Robert Borden and his supporters, in winning the war. I might mention amongst these Liberals, the names of McLEAN, CARVELL, FIELD, GUTHRIE, PARDEE, GRAHAM, CALDER, SIFTON, CREAR, BALANTYNE, BREWSTER, PUGSLEY, and others.

Before proceeding further, I just want to refer to a matter of which you have no doubt, heard or read considerable. It is termed the C.N.R. deal. When the war began, two trans-continental railways—the Grand Trunk Pacific and the Canadian Northern—were nearing completion. Parliament, at the session shortly preceding the war, had authorized the guarantee by the Dominion of Grand Trunk Securities to an amount not exceeding \$16,000,000, in order that with the proceeds, the roads might be finished. The declaration of the war prevented the sale of these railway securities. To have left the two great undertakings in an incomplete state would have rendered unproductive a large part of the money already invested. The companies would have had to cease construction, disband their organizations, dismiss 12,000 men, ruin contractors, cut off orders to supply men and impair the Government's security through accumulation of interest and postponement of the repayment period. The Government therefore, under the authority of Orders-in-Council, made advances of opinion notes to the two railways on the pledge of the guaranteed securities, just as it would make similar advances to a bank on the same security, if a bank had pledged the securities under the Finance Act. To the first named railway \$6,000,000 was advanced, and to the latter \$10,000,000. At the session of Parliament, held in the winter of 1915, the action thus taken was approved without a dissenting voice. As a result, both railways were completed and through services over their lines were inaugurated. This was that timely Government aid, safeguarded by the best available security, preserved the country from disastrous liquidation and the collapse of the two great enterprises which otherwise would have ensued. Should the Canadian Northern Railway pass the crisis and become a paying institution as now seems not improbable, a tremendous direct asset will accrue to the people of Canada. By way of compensation for the damages to the company the Government owns \$40,000,000 of the stock or 40 per cent of the entire capital. The term of the agree-

ment which will follow this measure will be entirely within the jurisdiction of, and may be dictated by, the Government; the shareholders, if they do not adhere to the terms stipulated in the agreement, will have to submit to the other alternative. Under the agreement the Government and the people of Canada will become, in effect, the owners of some 9,500 miles of railway and of about twenty-nine different companies operating various national utilities in every part of Canada. In proportion to our population, we become the owners and operators of the largest system of railways in any country in the world.

ENDORSED BY THE LIBERALS.

Many Liberal papers endorsed the measure. The Toronto Star (Liberal), discussing the purchase of the C.N.R., said: "We believe in the taking over of the C. N. R. and the express and telegraph companies that belong to it, and the opening of these as public services. We do not believe that there is or ever was, the slightest prospect that the present or any Government, Conservative or Liberal, will not confiscate the C. N. R. or seize it in the way some people now rashly say could and should be done, without an arbitration or appraisal of the values of what is to be taken over."

In advocating the taking over of the C.N.R. and subsidiary companies at the present time, we do so because we believe that if it is done now, when conditions are not only permissive, but force the issue upon the country, it never will be done—not until another generation, struggling with the complications of a wrong system, musters the courage to do it. It is a case for political partisanship to denounce the proposed taking over of the C.N.R. as a steal "the most daring steal ever attempted on Parliament." But how could any railroad system be taken over except by taking it over, and by appraisal of the value which it has at the time? Three years ago, when the last handout of forty-five millions of dollars was made to the C.N.R., the Liberals in parliament advocated the taking over of the road. Sir Wilfrid Laurier, in 1914, moved a resolution providing for the taking over of the road within a certain period. All the members of the Opposition voted for it. That resolution declared if the C. N. R. defaulted in the agreement then being entered into with the country, it should be taken over at a value to be arrived at by arbitration, not to exceed \$30,000,000. The Government now, defaulted and the Government now, at that period, adopts the declaration policy of the Liberals of three years ago, and the Opposition denounces the plan as "impudent," "beyond anything in human experience," "the question is not a partisan one. If the country does not take over the C. N. R., the property will pass into the hands of the C. P. R. There is no other destiny for it, and this country will be in the hands of railway, express, and telephone monopoly, the greatest in the world."

I might also mention in this connection, that both Mr. McIsaac, and Mr. Hughes, who are running in the adjoining County of King's, are out as Union candidates and publicly state, that if elected, they will give their strong support to the Borden Union Government.
