Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre, Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 50 acres extra.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

REPORT OF LADIES' AID SOCIETY OF THE PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND HOSPITAL.

I hereby submit the following Report of the Ladies' Aid Society of the Prince Edward Island Hospital.

At the annual meeting held in Y. M. C. A., May 20th, 1916, the Honorary President—Mrs. P. P. Taylor, Vice-President—Mrs. J. A. Matheson, Vice-President at large—Mrs. Benjamin Rogers, Vice-Presidents—Mrs. Hodgson, Mrs. Sterns, Mrs. G. F. Taylor, Mrs. Nash, Mrs. Full, Mrs. Bayer, Mrs. Walker, Miss Williams, Treasurer—Mrs. J. S. Bagnall, Secretary—Miss C. McLeod.

During the year, seven regular and three special meetings were held.

Mrs. P. P. Taylor, the Honorary President, kindly placed her rooms at the disposal of the Society to hold the monthly or any meetings in connection with the Society, which offer was accepted and much appreciated.

The first undertaking of the year was the Afternoon Tea and Strawberry Festival held on Hospital grounds, Tuesday, July 15th. This proved a great success. The sum of \$180.00 was realized. In September the Exhibition Lunch was held as in former years. This also proved a financial success—net proceeds being \$34.13.

During the year, the Society undertook to furnish a private room for maternity cases at the cost of \$200.00 in addition to that, it provided blankets, sheets, rubber sheets, pillow cases and night gowns for maternity ward. The room furnished by the Ladies' Aid Society and the couch and linen box were newly covered. White linen was supplied for nurses' tables, also curtains and blinds for nurses' rooms and two chairs for Nurses' Home.

Flag Day instead of Tag Day was held Easter Saturday. This also was a profitable undertaking—\$244 being realized.

At the May meeting \$150.00 was voted towards the purchase of a new Sterilizer for the Hospital. Nurses graduating exercises were held May 4th in Zion Church Hall. Mrs. James Tait very kindly presented the four graduating Nurses with beautiful bouquets. Proceeds amounted to \$250.00.

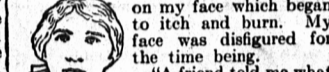
