SOUPS

EEL SOUP

Use the head and tail of a large eel, 3 quarts of water, 1/4 lb. butter, one leek, the blossoms and leaves of 5 marigolds, 1/2 pint of green peas or asparagus tips, 1/2 teacup of parsley, a bunch of thyme, 2 tablespoonsful of flour, 1 pint of milk, salt and pepper to taste.

Put the head and tail in a stew pan with the water, and allow to simmer gently for 2 1/2 hours or more till the fish breaks in pieces when tried with a fork. Strain through a china colander and pour back the liquor into the saucepan, add butter, and when boiling throw in the leek, green peas or asparagus, parsley, thyme, and marigold leaves all cut up small except the bunch of thyme which should be enclosed in a muslin bag. Then mix 2 heaped tablespoons of flour in a pint of milk in which you have laid the plucked blossoms of the marigolds, and when the vegetables are tender stir the milk and flour slowly and carefully in to prevent flour lumping. Keep on stirring after the soup comes to the boil for 8 or 10 minutes to remove the rawness from the flour. Some cooks prefer not to add the parsley till after soup has come to the boil. Remove thyme, season with pepper and salt before pouring into the tureen over slices of bread arranged in the bottom of tureen.

PEAS SOUP

Take 3 pints of blue peas, put them in a pan that will hold about 6 quarts. Cover them with rain water and place pan on a slow fire. Let them just simmer till they are broken, then mash them and put in 3 or 4 quarts of water, 6 or 8 onions, a few cloves, black pepper and 1/2 oz. Jamaica pepper, 1 lb. bacon, a little thyme, a little dried mint, 3 or 4 stalks of celery. Save the

LOBSTER BALLS

Take a fine hen lobster, 2 eggs, breadcrumbs, 2 ozs. butter, pepper, salt and cayenne pepper. Remove the meat from the lobster and pound it in a mortar with the coral and spaw. Mix with it not quite an equal quantity of breadcrumbs seasoned with pepper and salt, and cayenne to taste. Warm the butter and stir into the crumbs and lobster till well mixed. Flour your hands and roll mixture into balls the size of a duck's egg. brush them over with beaten egg, cover with breadcrumbs and fry till crisp and golden. Drain on paper and serve very hot.
