POULTRY AT TORONTO.

With the exception of a 1c decline in old roosters, live poultry remains at unchanged prices this week. Gunns quote live poultry delivered at Toronto this week as follows: Broilers, 18c per lb., chicks, 16c; old roosters, 11c; old fowl, 13c to 14c; a drop of 1c in each case; ducks, steady at 9c; ducklings, 11c; and turkeys, 18c per pound. Geese 7c per pound.

Dressed poultry brings 2c to 3c per pound over these prices. One firm tells 'The Sun' that it is getting so much live stuff that it cannot get it picked. 'All the pickers seem to have gone to the wars' is the report. This handicap is felt in other lines of industry, as well.

POTATOES AT TORONTO.

New Brunswick Cobblers are selling around \$1.60 per bag in car lots, delivered at Toronto. The Delawares have not yet commenced to come in from the East and will not for a week or ten days. Our report last week to the contrary was an error. Ontario potatoes are selling in the country at \$2 a bag and so there is little inducement to ship them in to Toronto where they come into competition with the cheaper and just-as-good Easterners. Western potatoes are reported to be a little higher than before.

Potatoes at Montreal.

There was small change in the Montreal market for potatoes, for which there was fair demand, and the market is moderately active, with sales of car lots of Green Mountains at \$1.50 to \$1.55, and Quebec varieties at \$1.30 to \$1.35 per bag of 90 lbs., at the track, while in a wholesale jobbing way the former are selling at \$1.85 to \$1.90, and the latter at \$1.65 to \$1.75 per bag of 80 lbs. at the store.

Tuesday, Evening, Sept. 26. Farmers who pinned their faith on the dairy cow are reaping the profits of a wise investment. Cheese and butter continue to be the startling features of the market, the latter moving to a high level. Farmers receive enough 'black eyes' in the scramble to keep alive, and in this case it is some one else who 'gets it in the neck'. Townspeople who have formed the habit of greasing their bread with butter are beginning to find that, expensive and all as the bread is, still the trimmings are even more so.

Every time the hen cackles, too she declares a dividend on her 'fed bill'—something that the lorry rooster cannot do. There is no more reason why roosters should be kept with the flock of hens now any more than there was a month ago when the eggs were fried in their shell every time they came into contact with the sun's rays.
