diamond ace, and that was the end of the grand slam.  
 North obviously did not know it, but he was guilty of a very bad error when he responded to South's Blackwood four notrump with the five-diamond bid that showed one ace. On the strength of that bid, after North had made a free bid in clubs and then raised hearts, South was fully justified in thinking that a grand slam would be an absolute pyxton. Because, if North was bidding correctly, he had to have the diamond ace!

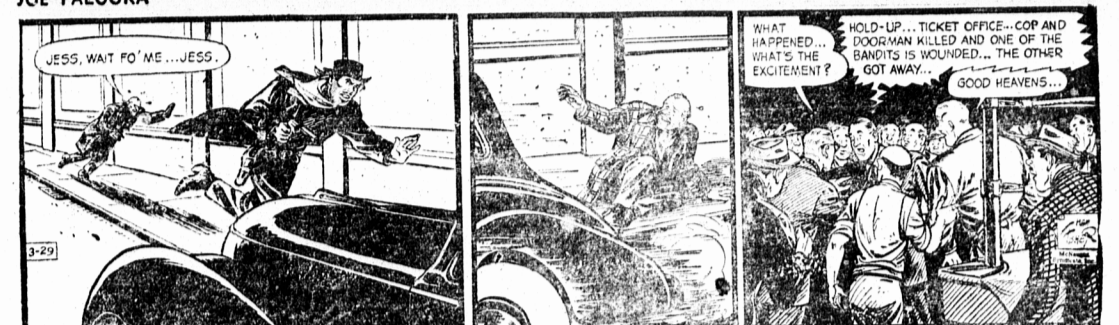

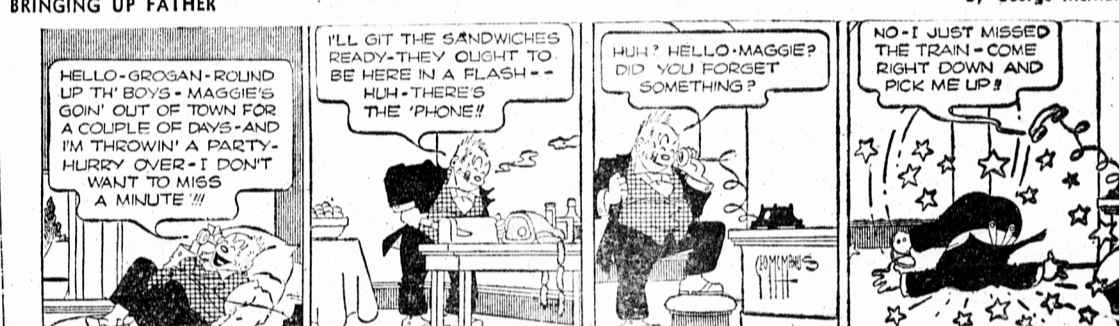

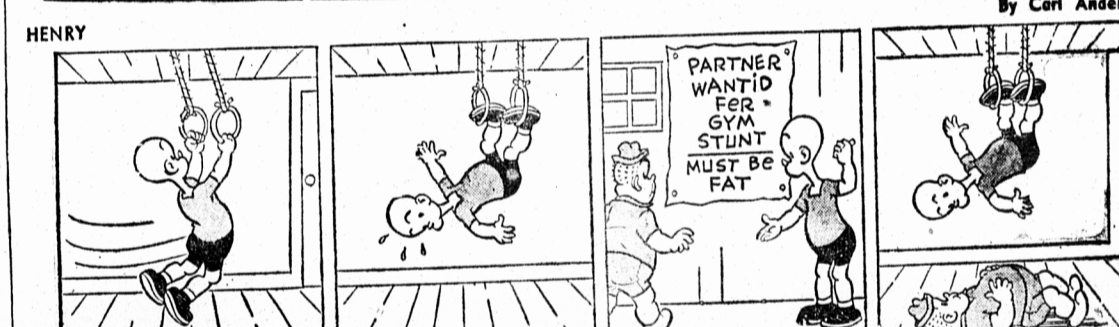
