Bluenose Will Race Thebaud (Canadian Press) HALIFAX, N. S. Oct. 28—The veteran schooner Bluenose, of Lunenburg, which won the championship of the North Atlantic fishing fleets from the Gloucester schooner Elsie in 1921 will meet her recent conqueror in the Lipton exhibition series, Gertrude L. Thebaud of Gloucester, off Halifax on Saturday, November 8, in the first of a two out of three series for championship honors and the Dennis Cup. This decision, arrived at today by the trustees of the trophy, was announced this afternoon, after proposals setting the date of the first race and stipulating prizes of \$1,500 to the winner and \$1,000 to the loser had been wired to the vessel owners and accepted. The trustees, at yesterday's meeting had decided that a series this fall would be inadvisable, but reconsidered their decision on request of the Gloucester committee.
