Provincial Legislature (Continued from page 1) "The borrowing of this money is a great question with the farmers in my section and I believe I am speaking for them and for the farmers from one end of the county to the other.

THE SPEAKER read the report of the Committee on the bill amending the County Court Amendment Act, providing that no appeal in future can be made from a decision of the County Court unless the amount is over \$100.

MR. J. D. STEWART moved the following amendment to the report of the Committee on the Bill: "THAT THE REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE BE AMENDED BY inserting therein between the words 'the same' and the word 'and' the following:—

AND WHEREAS the carrying out of this policy with respect to the Highways Act, they have made an addition to the public debt during the past year of upwards of \$100,000.00 AND WHEREAS the work put upon the public highways upon which said moneys have been expended are for the most part not of a permanent nature.

MR. STEWART in moving the amendment said he had already expressed his view in Committee and it was hardly necessary to add anything. This government has come into power upon the platform that they would make revenue and expenditure meet. As stated in the preamble to this amendment, by the carrying out of this scheme they have already added \$100,000 to the debt and if this bill is put through the debt will be increased practically 50 per cent.

THE SPEAKER read the amendment as moved by Mr. Stewart, and the House adjourned until 3 p. m. Wednesday.

Exactly the same amendment had been put by the House two years ago on an amendment to the Tax Bill, modelled on the same principle, and the Speaker had allowed it. The Committee have not yet reported on the bill and he would submit that this amendment be the report of the Committee.

MR. STEWART: That might be perfectly right if we were now moving an amendment after the report was adopted. Then the motion would be referred back to the Committee, as my hon. friend suggests. But the report of the Committee is not yet adopted, and I move that the Committee make this report.

FISH SWIM WITH TAILS

The swimming machinery of a fish is his tail. The fish is surrounded by water which exerts an equal pressure on all sides. Every movement the fish makes either with his tail or otherwise therefore moves the entire fish. By moving his tail from side to side he propels himself forward in the water and he takes the direction in which his tail is bent. His fins help him in swimming, but not much, their use being principally to aid him in raising or lowering himself in the water. The tail, in moving from side to side, would create a current in the water from the head to the tail providing the fish stood still, but of course when the fish moves it's tail the body moves forward. It is the current of water being formed. Scientific theory asserts that the water at the head of the fish is displaced first when the fish moves forward, but to observation it appears as if the water moves at both ends and at the sides at the same time.
