JAMES STEWART of Paton & Co., returned last night from Pictou via Georgetown by special which he had hired, where he has been in connection with the goods there awaiting shipment to the Island. Mr. Stewart reports that the work on the Minto is progressing rapidly. When he left at half past two all the stabs had been removed from the propeller shaft and the first new blade was being lowered. The workmen now expect to have the ship ready to sail by Thursday, and it is probably she will try Charlottetown. Orders to that effect are now being awaited from Ottawa. Mr. Stewart speaks in the highest terms of M. C. Webster, I.G.R. agent at Pictou, and the other obliging officials at the wharf, all of whom are doing all in their power to facilitate the transportation of freight. The millinery goods which Mr. Stewart was looking for had been reshipped from Pictou to Moncton to be transported via the Capes but owing to inclement weather could not be taken across without injury. They were sent back to Pictou and Mr. Stewart found them Saturday night on the 10:30 train from Seabrook. He had them shipped by the Stanley yesterday. They left Pictou at 2:30 p.m. yesterday and reached Charlottetown at 9 p.m., preparatory to the latest instance of transportation by that route yet recorded. There was also shipped for Paton & Co., two cars carpet, oilcloths, etc.

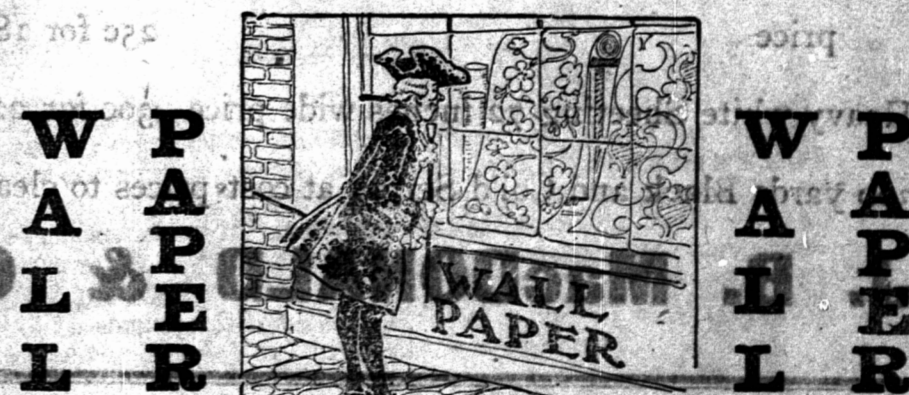
