Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole heir of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, who has inherited a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta, Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entries by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency, but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—First year, 1/2 acre; second year, 1/2 acre; third year, 1/2 acre; fourth year, 1/2 acre; fifth year, 1/2 acre; sixth year, 1/2 acre; seventh year, 1/2 acre; eighth year, 1/2 acre; ninth year, 1/2 acre; tenth year, 1/2 acre.

U. S. War Department Sells War Material

(Associated Press)

WASHINGTON, Mar. 29.—Sales to Foreign Governments of more than two hundred million dollar worth of surplus war supplies were announced by the War Department today. Most of the material went to France, whose purchase included smokeless powder, acids, copper, cannon and steel plates, for which \$155,000,000 was paid.

Italy bought \$41,000,000 worth of machine guns and ammunition, acids and other supplies. The Netherlands bought \$685,000 worth of nitrate of soda. About a million dollars worth of airplanes and supplies, \$496,000 worth of soldiers' personal equipments, \$294,000 worth of machine guns and \$171,000 worth of hand-grenades went to Czech-Slovakia.

WAR SAVINGS

Ottawa.—Fort William and Port Arthur had sold \$11,747 worth of War Savings and Thrift Stamps up to the middle of March. Of these, Fort William claims \$7,186 and Port Arthur \$4,560. The combined sales for the week of March 7th are \$1,519.

The school children at Ottawa have bought \$2,500 worth of Thrift Stamps within the last five or six weeks.

Fredonction, N.B. reports good progress. Practically all the stores there have War Savings and Thrift Stamps on sale, and the schools are responding splendidly. The Women's Organizations are also getting behind the movement.

Regina, Sask., a town of about 800 inhabitants, reports sales of \$1,321 worth of War Savings and Thrift Stamps during the last two months. The public school, which has an average attendance of 150, has taken not less than \$758 worth, or an average of \$5 per scholar.

Melville, Sask., reports \$840 worth of Stamps sold up to the end of Feb. Saskatchewan cities report the following sales of Stamps:—Regina, \$6,476; Saskatoon, \$5,200; Moose Jaw, \$4,880.

Shelbrook, Sask., with a population of four or five hundred, sold \$460 worth of Stamps during the first two weeks that they were placed on sale.

Calgary is enthusiastic over the War Savings campaign, the "drive" during Horse Show week being one of the liveliest of efforts. Organizations of all kinds, co-operated splendidly with the result that not only was the city covered thoroughly, but the hundreds of people from outside points received their first introduction to War Savings and Thrift Stamps. The sales in the local, General Post Office, before the "drive" opened, amounted to \$2,400.

At Leithbridge, 2,000 children attending the schools, have each been supplied with a Thrift card together with a Stamp attached. Other towns in Alberta are adopting this idea.

Bluff has, to date, sold \$3,000 worth of War Savings and Thrift Stamps.

At Irvine, Alberta, where the Stamps sales in January amounted only to \$750, they were increased to \$550 in Feb. Thrift "drives" are now becoming a general feature in the prairie provinces.

Last week Portage la Prairie, Man., put on one with a cabaret feature, the result being that the sale of Stamps was increased very greatly. Selkirk, Man., has also had its "drive."

A Woman's Branch has been formed in connection with the Central Ontario division of the War Savings organization. Separate offices have been opened and plans outlined for a vigorous campaign.

Pembroke, Ontario, public school has made a fine record for the sale of War Savings and Thrift Stamps. For the nine weeks ending March 14th, \$922.25 worth has been sold. For the four weeks ending Feb. 8th, sales amounted to \$485 and from Feb. 8th, to March 14th, they amounted to \$437.25. In other words this means an average saving of 3 cents per pupil per day.

Fourth Entry In Aerial Flight

LONDON, Mar. 29.—Great Britain's biggest airship, the R-34, which in the near future will attempt a trans-Atlantic flight, had its first severe test yesterday when it set forth from the Clyde for a circuit of the Irish coast. The airship returned to her base to-day after remaining aloft nearly twenty hours, encountering the severest weather.

While the first of the three trials which are expected to precede the trans-Atlantic attempt is regarded in expert quarters here tonight as highly successful, there is nevertheless disappointment that the airship was unable to complete the 24-hour test planned. High winds and extreme cold prevailed for two days in the waters around the British Isles, and last night the big airship was heavily buffeted by the gales and snow-storms, and the cold was so intense the water in the ballast tanks froze. She was forced to ascend to a high altitude to free herself from the blizzard conditions.

Opinion is expressed here this evening among air experts that the unusually severe weather conditions may postpone any attempts at a trans-Atlantic flight until better weather is more certain.

The extreme cold and the heavy halstorms severely taxed the strength of those airmen who have participated in the recent cruise around the Danish coast, and last night's flight over the Irish coast. The British airships, it is declared have behaved splendidly under the most trying conditions and there is every belief that the R-34 and sister ships will be able to surpass the Zeppelin achievement of 100 hours in flight.
