SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

LESSON VIII. MAY 25. JOSEPH AND BENJAMIN. Gen. 42. GOLDEN TEXT. "He that loveth his brother abideth in the light."—1 John 2: 10. POINTED SUGGESTIONS.

By Rev. D. W. Snider. Terrible are the forebodings which are fanned by guilt, into fear. They are bad enough when they arise from the situation which is inexplicable, while the conscience is void of offence. Joseph's brethren had their trouble over the appearance of their guilt concerning the money in their sacks multiplied to the quantity of X by the fact of their guilt concerning their brother.

The courteous bearing is always in order, and it may be said that it is always profitable. But there comes "the mock of laughter in the soul" to men whose ways have been wicked when, for the sake of their skin, they are obsequious when they have been wont to be harsh. Contrast the present courtesies of Joseph's brethren with their conduct towards Joseph before and at the time they sold him.

The solicitude of Joseph for his father makes concerning him and his eager questioning about Benjamin reveal an affectionate tenderness and regard which is beautiful, and just as many a time, is worthy in a son of that as beautiful. What else than such inquisitive concern, born of filial gratitude, wrench of soul, born of a father's love, when it cries, "If I be bereaved of my children, I am bereaved?"

Manhood's crown of affection is fashioned from its tears. They are its resplendent gems. Tears, of course, sometimes, are idle and cheap. There are the quiet tears of the drunkard and shallow-souled. But they are poured out in the open and are shed with his tears, but he never rose to a more manly height in all his career than when he retired to his chamber to let them flow. Manliness and religion as well, without emotion, is dwarfed, weakened, incomplete.

While the gentleness and splendor of the manly affection of Joseph was

revealed by his tears, his strength and princely executive qualities came into evidence as he returned from his chamber in complete mastery of himself. He was a stronger self after he washed his face and refrained himself. Stronger, not because he was washed, etc., but because of what he had washed. As the rain strengthens the plant, so the flood of affection upon the spirit of Joseph made him stronger to do.

In the manner in which the Prime Minister of Egypt had his brothers arranged at table and served, there was a full remembrance shown of rights and wrongs. No one is called upon to forget. Forgiveness is made the grander by so much the more it remembers. Forgiveness is not designed to wipe out a faculty, but to remove all stains from all faculties.

How easily the good time makes men unmindful of their fears. At that meal in Joseph's house he gave his brothers such a good time that they were put at their ease. That is fine hospitality. Reflect upon the separations which are forced by caste and creedal differences. While the lesson is teaching us great brotherly tenderness, the same reveals the fact that under the customs of Egypt the brotherhood of man was a thought that was very far off. Only Christianity, the brotherhood of Jesus, has brought that great doctrine of helpfulness into light.

What have you to say about this thing which the lessons about Joseph and his brethren brings to our notice, namely, that good has come to the brothers out of the evil they sought to do to Joseph? In pondering upon the mysterious working out of the providence of God towards men thin first, put emphatically first, the compassion of God, and next fail not to remember how hard is the way of the transgressor and the bitterness of the road to repentance.

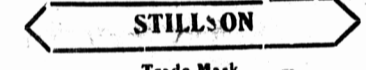
