MARLBOROUGH AND DUCHESS HAVE PARTED

Because Her \$5,000,000 Dowry Was Not Large Enough. W. K. Vanderbilt Assumes Role of Peacemaker. There Will be a Quiet Separation Without Appeal to Courts.

New York, Oct. 24.—The London correspondent of the Tribune cables as follows: "The disagreement between the Duke and Duchess of Marlborough, which has been prolonged over a period of eighteen months or more, English society is convinced will result in their separation unless the earnest efforts now being made by the father of the Duchess and other relatives result in a reconciliation. W. K. Vanderbilt, the father of the Duchess, arrived in London on Tuesday and went directly to Blenheim, where his daughter is with her children. The Duke is not at Blenheim, and all negotiations for the reconciliation have been conducted through Mr. Vanderbilt. Incompatibility is the only reason assigned for the strained relations existing between the Duke and the Duchess. This has been more acute during the past eighteen months, and they have been apart for increasingly long periods. The Duke's relations with his wife's family have not been cordial for some time, chiefly due, it is said, to the disappointment to his expectations caused by the second marriage of W. K. Vanderbilt. Close friends of the Duke say he is one of those men who could never be reconciled or consistently agreeable, and that the question of money really need trouble them not at all, if it were not for other sources of disagreement. The two children, the Marquis of Blandford and Lord Ivor Spencer Churchill are of course, a powerful deterrent to the separation of the Duke and Duchess. Their friends sincerely hope that a reconciliation may be effected, although it is said that the family of the Duchess has foreseen the ultimate result for several years.

NEGROES RAISED ROW IN PHILA

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Oct. 23.—Blotting by thousands of negroes was caused tonight by a production of the Rev. Thomas Dixon's play, "The Clansman." Before it was ended public rejoicing inside the Walnut Street Theatre, where the play was on, and a score or more of blacks were badly beaten. Several went to hospitals and a number were arrested. A committee of ministers called Mayor Weaver yesterday to protest against the play, and thousands of postal cards were sent to the sixty thousand negroes in the negro section, calling upon them to march upon the theatre and stop the play by force. Recent lynchings in the South were attributed to it. Three thousand negroes filled the streets, and two squads of reserve police, from the City Hall had all they could do to protect the theatre goers. It was not long after the curtain went up that a fight began in the gallery and down into the street, came a negro, his head and face streaming with blood. "Rush the theatre," the crowd cried, but just then one hundred more police charged on the blacks.
