Trading Slow At Montreal, Toronto

TORONTO, Feb. 22—(CP)—Trading slowed to a crawl on the Toronto Stock Exchange today as a handful of issues fluctuated irregularly lacking leadership from a holidaying New York market. Western oils continued yesterday's weaker trend. Base metals tended firmer and senior golds slipped lower. Waite Amulet featured base metals, opening strongly in brisk dealings and then sagging as traders realized profits on recent advances. The stock recovered at the close to show a gain of 1-4 from the previous close.

At Montreal
MONTREAL, Feb. 22—(CP)—Caution displayed by investors today sent the industrial and mining turnovers at 1949 low levels on the Montreal Stock Exchange and Wall Street. Lack of leadership from Wall Street—closed in observance of Washington's birthday—was a main factor which made trading dull on the two Montreal markets. Investors moved undecidedly in either directions and price adjustments generally were confined to fractions. Mines were slightly improved. Industrial sales were approximately 20-20 shares, a drop of 2-300 from Monday, and lowest recorded since last Aug. 27 when total sales had been 19,584.
