The market was well supplied in all lines yesterday and largely attended. Apples in all varieties were very plentiful and sold from 10 to 15cts per peck. The first plums of the season were in and brought 10cts per qt. Butter per lb sold from 21 to 22cts and eggs per doz 15 and 16cts. The price of hay advanced slightly from last market, selling from 70 to 80 cts per cwt. Oats (new) per bus brought from 35 to 40c while old oats sold at 45c. 30 and 40c per bus wholesale and retail respectively was paid for potatoes.
