Miss Juniper who was busy with a class of twenty four young ladies from Principal Seaman's room and West Kent Street School, deep in the mysteries of "flaky pastry," received the visitors very cordially, explaining the art of pastry in the manner in which she did, and demonstrating the same as she went along with her lesson, was most interesting, while the class following Miss Juniper's example as she explained minutely each stage in the lesson, turned out some excellent pastry. Miss Juniper kindly asked the visitors to sample the pastry made by a former class that morning and which were made into dainty little mince pies, all the cookies made by the students of the P. W. C. There should be no doubt in the minds of the parents of children in this Province as to the necessity and usefulness of this training that they may become good cooks, and in every way economical, as in every instance throughout the lesson this seemed to be the aim of the teacher--to instill into the pupils' minds, the need of economy, neatness and cleanliness in every thing pertaining to the work of domestic science. In this City the eighth, ninth and tenth grades of Prince Street and West Kent School take up Domestic Science for two hours once a week and are then thoroughly instructed in the art of cooking and making each ingredient used, while a complete list of the different prices of groceries, in this City are lately written on the blackboard, thus giving the pupils a good insight into the value of what they are using and should greatly help them when sent to purchase for the home. A morning of profitable enjoyment can be had by a visit to such a capable and painstaking teacher. The visitors visited the Manual Training room before leaving the College, also the Model School and the chemical laboratories.
