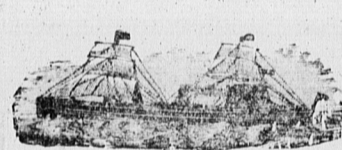

A NEW AERONAUT RECORD.

ALBANY, N. Y., May 26—Glenn H. Curtiss did not start on his proposed flight from Albany to New York this morning. On account of rain and unfavorable winds, he has postponed his start until this afternoon or tomorrow morning.

DAYTON, Ohio, May 26—Orville C. Wright has made five aeroplane flights here within a few hours, in one of which he reached an altitude of 2,700 feet and from which he landed at terrific speed, reaching the earth in one minute and 28 seconds, or at a rate of over 30 miles an hour thus establishing a world's record for descent.

The machine dropped under perfect control and landed within fifteen feet of the end of the starting rail. For the first time in his eighty-two years Bishop Milton Wright, father of the aviator, left the earth with Orville and was taken 300 feet in the air.

AT CAPITAL.

OTTAWA, May 26—Hon. L. P. Brodeur returned to the Capital this morning after a few days spent at his home in Ste. Hilarie. He will not take any very active charge of his Department for some days yet, pending further rest and convalescence.

CREMATION INCREASING IN MONTREAL.

MONTREAL, May 26—Cremation is making its way and bids fair to become fairly general among the Protestant portion of the population. The crematory here was established in 1902.

In that year there were 3 cremations—1903—6, 1904—6, 1905—16; 1906—19, 1907—20, 1908—52, 1909—52. So far this year there have been 49.
