## S.D.U.— 1948-49 I.P.F.B.L. Champions

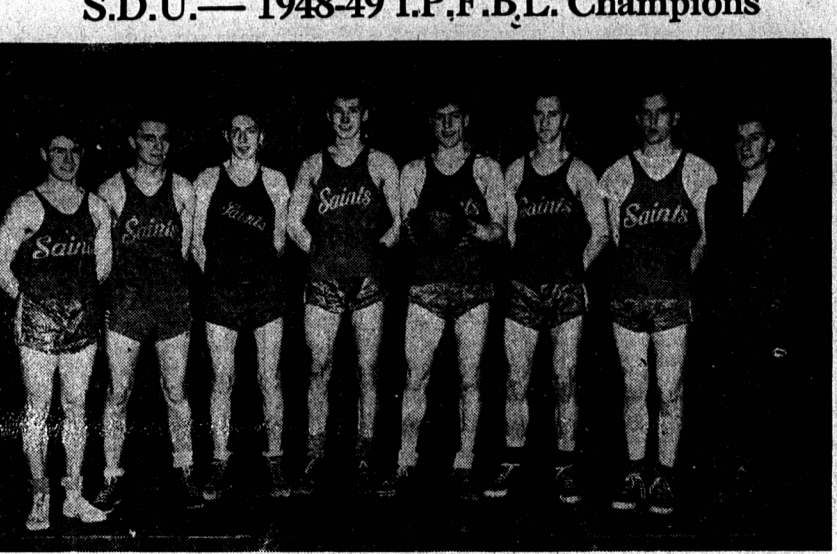

### LISTOWEL, Ont., April 11 (CP) — Jack Fritz, coach of Sydney's eliminated Millionaires, picks Ottawa Senators to whip Toronto Marlboros in the eastern final of the Allan Cup playoffs.

Senators lead Sherbrook 3-2 in games in the Quebec Senior League hockey finals and Fritz says they are a sure bet to win the best-of-seven series.

Stopping off on his way back to the Maritimes to visit his mother here, Fritz said the Maple Leaf farm hands are not smooth enough to cope with the well-organized Senators.

Fritz, a product of Listowel ice ponds, who left local junior and intermediate clubs to reach the Maritimes via Sudbury and Kirkland Lake teams, doubts he will accept a coaching appointment next season because of business reasons.

The tall former navy officer, had hoped to lead Millionaires to the Allan Cup, a goal they came within one game of reaching a few years back when he was a playing member.

Toronto won the best-of-five series 3-1 with one game tied. Fritz pointed to the two games which Marlboros tied up with less than 50 seconds to go and said the law of averages should have given Millionaires one of them and that actually they should have had both.

He took no issue with the Toronto press for saying his charges lacked finish around the nets. It looked that way, he admitted, but actually it was just over-anxiousness.

## Jack Kramer Hopes To Remain In Tennis Big Time For Several Years

LONDON, April 11—(AP)—Big Jack Kramer, who says he is well on the way to earning his second \$100,000 by playing professional tennis, concedes himself three more years in the big-time.

"When someone comes up who can beat me consistently," said Jack in an interview while playing in London, "I'll retire from competitive play completely."

Kramer, who will be 28 Aug. 1, is acknowledged the best tennis player in the world today. He swept the amateur "triple crown" in 1947—winning the Wimbledon championships, United States title and helping America hold the Davis Cup—and started to cash in with a pro debut on Dec. 28 that year.

Kramer brought his touring troupe, including Bobby Riggs, Danny Pails and Pancho Segura, to Europe in March. From December, 1947, through last month, Jack beat Riggs, his regular opponent, at least five out of six times.

The act needs to be freshened, with a new opponent for Kramer. He hopes that an amateur will capture the triple crown this summer and join the troupe.

"Second best," Kramer said, "are Pancho Gonzalez and John Bromwich, who is coming out of Australia this year with nothing to lose and everything to gain. This might be John's year."
