THE MONUMENT FUND.

The movement to erect a public monument to our brave soldiers who fell in South Africa has been very heartily endorsed in words by public men and others in all the walks of life. It has met the approval of the Provincial Premier and of the Mayor and City Council, the latter having unanimously resolved to make a civic grant towards this worthy object. Some individual subscriptions have been received and acknowledged, and so far as we have knowledge the public approbation is general and there have been no objections made. This is so far good, but it is not enough.

Money is wanted and we are confident that a multitude stand ready to give such sums as they can conveniently donate for an object that they have at heart. The intention has been that the offering should be mainly spontaneous. There are many however, quite ready to give, who may wait to be called upon. To accommodate these, and especially to give the school children a chance to contribute their mites to a worthy and patriotic object, as many of them would desire to do, it has been suggested to us that the aid of the school-teachers throughout the Island would be invaluable. Teachers are, as THE GUARDIAN knows, among the most progressive and patriotic of our citizens. They take an intelligent pride in Canada and the Empire, and we doubt not take an interest in inculcating like sentiments among their pupils.

THE GUARDIAN would be greatly pleased if the school teachers would take hold of this movement, afford their pupils a chance to contribute, and forward what they have to give with the names of the youthful donors. It would be a source of pride to the latter in the years to come, when they shall have become men and women, to know that they had a share in building the Soldier's Monument. In the meantime we trust that all persons young or old who think well of the movement will forward their donations, whether small or large to the Treasurer of the Fund at their earliest convenience. It not that politicians and electors of both parties have been for a good while in an attitude of expectancy and readiness. And there is a general feeling against a prolonged campaign, which always operates to restrict business and disturb the usual calm of social relations. We therefore anticipate that the announcement of the date of election will be received with a measure of relief throughout the country. A month hence and all will be over. The decision may be it will be accepted by the country.

The term of the late Parliament would not have ended by legal limitation till August next, and it would have been easily possible to have held another session in the meantime. The census would also have been taken in the interim, but it would have been too late after that to make the usual readjustment of the representation as between Provinces. All Governments are reluctant to put off an election to the last moment. The House now dissolved was elected in June, 1896 and has therefore been in existence about four years, and three months. Since 1st July 1897 there have been eight general elections in a little more than thirty-three years. Through the coming general election is the ninth of the Dominion series, this will be but the third time that a Liberal Government has issued the writs, six general elections having been held under Liberal-Conservative Administrations.
