QUEBEC LIBERALS. Internal Dissentions Being Aired Through the Opposition Press.

QUEBEC, Oct. 22. As foreshadowed yesterday, quite a ferment has been created in the Liberal camp here by the rumors of Sir Henri Joly de Lotbiniere's retirement and Mr. Tarte's alleged scheming to replace him by Mr. Brodeur, of Rouville, which would entail upon this district the loss of one of its cabinet seats. Something akin to the excitement provoked in political circles by the publication of your correspondent's interview with the Hon. F. Longueville relative to the scheme to continue the late Sir Adolphe Chapleau as Lieutenant-Governor has also been aroused in political circles by the publication last evening in the Bleu local organ, the Courier du Canada, of a lengthy letter over the signature of 'A Liberal,' who gives as his excuse for resorting to such a channel of publicity that the two great French Liberal organs of the province, the Patrie and the Soleil, would refuse to admit it to their columns, the one because it is Mr. Tarte's organ and the other because, though Mr. Pacaud's property, it is altogether at Sir Wilfrid Laurier's mercy. The writer, who apparently knows too much about the internal dissentions of the party here and their causes, appears to be other than what he professes to be a Liberal—makes a formidable attack upon the party management, and especially upon Sir Wilfrid Laurier's disdain for the petty details of administration, which it is claimed, is encouraging the most dangerous intrigues by men like Mr. Tarte that are gradually sapping the Liberal unity and strength.

In the course of this attack, he lays bare a number of the complaints against the government, which hitherto have been only talked of in the intimacy of the party circle. One of these relates to Sir Henri Joly de Lotbiniere's portfolio and in this connection the writer charges that Sir Henri Joly de Lotbiniere desired to retire long ago and that only for Mr. Tarte's opposition in the cabinet the present Judge Choquette would now be filling his position. It was Mr. Tarte, he says, who objected to Mr. Choquette, much to the disappointment of the Quebec district wing of the party, who have for two years been obliged to put up with their cabinet representatives with Sir Wilfrid Laurier, who has no department; Sir Henri Joly de Lotbiniere, who was out of public life for ten years, and who is almost a stranger to the present generation of party workers, and Mr. Dobell, who was a Tory until his entry into the ministry, and whom scarcely a Liberal of the Quebec district outside of Quebec city personally knows. To allay the dissatisfaction here the writer thinks that Judge Choquette should be invited by his friends to resign from the bench and to run again for Montagny in order that he may be qualified to take Sir Henri Joly de Lotbiniere's place, which should be again insisted upon by all the Liberals of this district.

He also believes that there should be an early change in the management of the 'Soleil,' which is too Ministerial altogether for the Liberals, and he suggests the Hon. Mr. Dechene, the present Commissioner of Agriculture in the Local Government, as the fittest man to take his place in order to keep the party solid and to preserve its remarkable strength in this province.

Among the cases cited by him as supplying grievous cause of complaint is that of Dr. Guay, M.P., for Levis, who was promised the appointment of medical superintendent of the Grosse Ile quarantine station, but whose nomination for some mysterious reason, hangs fire; that of Major Pinaut, M.P.P. for Matane, who was promised the post of Deputy Minister of Militia, but whose appointment is also delayed owing, it is said, to the intervention of Senator Pelletier on behalf of his relative, Col. Panet; and that of the Hon. Charles Langelier, whose present candidature for Montagny is being choked off by the same intrigues who got Mr. Choquette removed out of their way. In conclusion, the complainant says that these are only a few of the current grievances but there are many others and that he has no doubt that the exposure of these and of the situation of the Liberal party in the Quebec district will have the desired effect and contribute to its early amelioration.

Singular Omission

Paris, Oct. 22 Major Marchand's report, telegraphed from Cairo, was received during the course of the night. It does not mention the arrival at Fashoda of General Kitchener, and only gives an account of the incidents of the expedition, with an elaborate description of the route followed, the points he occupied, the manner of occupation, the rising of the flag, the forces left at each point and the treaties of submission concluded with the tribes, in addition to referring to an encounter with the dervishes. The report only goes as far as the beginning of September, and says that on Aug. 20 the supplies of the party were abundant. The reason for the omission of any mention of the arrival of General Kitchener at Fashoda is said to be the fact that the report of Major Marchand was not ready when Captain Baratier left Fashoda. When the Captain started from that place he did not think he would go beyond Khartoum. Major Marchand, however, deemed it advisable to send the finished portion of the report intending to despatch the remainder of it as soon as Captain Baratier returned. But the captain, on arriving at Omdurman, found there instructions telling him to go on to Cairo, from which place he will proceed to France. It is believed in certain quarters that Captain Baratier is the bearer of a verbal report which the French authorities were not willing to trust upon the British telegraph lines.

London, Oct. 21.—A despatch to the Exchange Telegraph Company, from Portsmouth, says the British Admiralty has issued orders that no dock yard repairs are to be commenced upon ships belonging to the reserve squadrons unless they can be completed within forty eight hours.
