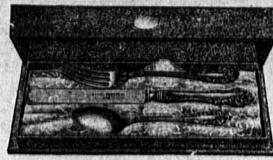

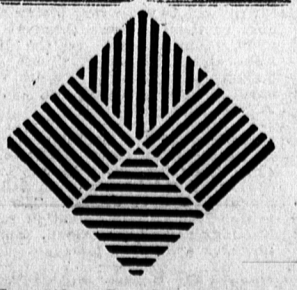

Test for Astigmatism
