Raisin drops are excellent to serve with afternoon tea.

Ingredients: 1/4 cups brown sugar, one cup lard or butter, three eggs, one teaspoon cinnamon, three cups flour, pinch of salt, one cup cooked raisins, one cup nuts, one teaspoon soda, one-third cup hot water, one teaspoon vanilla.

Cream sugar and butter, add beaten eggs, dissolve soda in hot water, add flour, cinnamon, vanilla, then add floured raisins and nuts. Drop from spoon on greased tins. Bake in hot oven.
