ANOTHER ROLLER MILL—John Dixon the enterprising miller of DeSable is now busy preparing his mill for the reception of the new plant, known as the Hungarian process. The plant was ordered from Mr. McKee, representing the firm of Wm. and J. G. Grey of Toronto Oat, and is expected to arrive about Nov. 25th. This is to be a three brake mill, and in addition to the usual machinery, Mr. Dixon has ordered a Bran Disturber. It is believed on the Island which will enable him to take from one to three per cent more flour from the wheat. This is now a very large and well equipped mill with an abundant supply of water, and when fitted with the new process will be unsurpassed by any in the Province. As a miller Mr. Dixon stands second to none having had a life-long experience in the business and there is no doubt that the new enterprise will add greatly to his already large patronage.

WILLIAM M. DONALD of Park Corner departed this life on Thursday October 9th.
