UNITED KINGDOM BUYS SOUTH AFRICAN EGGS LONDON, Sept. 11 (CP) - Britain has concluded an agreement with South Africa to purchase the Union's exportable surplus of shell eggs in 1946-47. Shipments this year are not expected to exceed 1,750,000 dozen but production may be higher next year.

Canada now is the main supplier of shell eggs to Britain, shipping 30,000,000 dozen worth \$2,950,000 (\$13,374,000) in the first six months of 1947 against 22,650,000 dozen worth \$2,610,890 in the same period of 1946.
