

STATUE UNVEILED

Ceremony Witnessed by Large Concourse

ON VICTORIA'S DAY

Statue of Notre Dame de Mount Carmel a Credit to the Acadians.

It has been customary with the good people of Mount Carmel of whom a large number follow the dangerous occupation of fishing as a means of livelihood—for themselves and families to invoke the blessings of Almighty God on their arduous labors at the commencement of operations. As fishing operations were about to begin, the 23rd inst. at 8.30 p. m., was chosen by their beloved pastor, as the day and hour for the solemn occasion. As the hour approached sixty-three fishing boats were seen moving out from the different parts of the shore within the limits of the parish, and under the influence of a gentle wind, gliding gracefully over the placid waters of "Old Northumberland" to the rendezvous in front of the rock, and in full view of that gradually rising point of land on which stands that grand and imposing edifice recently erected by the zealous and ever faithful Acadians, under the enlightened guidance of their untiring, energetic, and far-seeing young Pastor as their place of worship and the guardians of their faith and devotions.

At the church, an immense concourse of people assembled, among whom could be seen a large representation from the neighboring parishes, and while the choir, to the soul-stirring strains of music, chanted the Magnificat, the procession formed in the following order:

1st.—The Cross with Acolytes.
2nd.—His Lordship Bishop McDonald, and Clergy in attendance.—Rev. F. F. S. Boudreau of Egmont Bay, Rev. J. A. McDonald of Miscouche and Rev. I. C. McLean of Summerside.

3rd.—The choir under the direction of the Pastor.

4th.—The Congregation.

The procession formed, it slowly wended its way to the shore, to the singing of the Litanies of the Blessed Virgin. As the cross, heading the procession, appeared in full view of the assembled fishermen it was solemnly saluted by the sixty-three tiny flags fluttering at the mast heads—the whole forming a most impressive sight, once seen, never forgotten. After the benediction given by His Lordship, the procession pensively retraced its steps to the church, the choir in the meantime singing Ave Maris Stella. The benediction of the Blessed Sacrament brought to a close, what appeared to the writer the most faith-inspiring ceremony he had ever witnessed.

Friday the 24th will be long and dearly remembered by the parishioners of Mount Carmel, as, on that day, they again assembled to participate in the performance of a long deferred duty; the unveiling and

blessing of the Statue of Notre Dame de Mount Carmel. This statue has a history and the formalities of to-day prove beyond the shadow of a doubt that "history repeats itself."

Some thirty-five years (35) years ago, this statue was erected by the late Father Quevillon, the then pastor of this parish.

After a period of twenty years the wooden monument on which it stood was demolished by the action of the elements and the parishioners longed for an opportunity to proceed to its re-erection on a more solid and durable foundation.

Knowing this, their zealous pastor, Rev. P. P. Arsenault appealed to the children of the parish, who generously responded, and in a short time, provided sufficient funds for its re-erection. This done an architect was required, and the man of the hour proved to be Mr. E. J. Duffy, of Charlottetown, who designed and erected the monument which is a masterpiece of architectural beauty. The pedestal is sixteen feet high, of gray stone, of the Gothic order, perpendicular style, with suitable inscription. The Monument is twenty-one feet high and the first of its kind in the Diocese.

The pastor and flock wish to convey in this public manner their most sincere thanks to Mr. Duffy for the very efficient and satisfactory way he has performed his work.

At nine o'clock His Lordship vested in his Pontifical robes sang Mass, assisted by Rev. D. McDonald of Tignish as high priest, Revs. S. Boudreau of Egmont Bay and J. A. McDonald of Miscouche, as deacon and sub-deacon of honor, Rev. F. X. Gallant of Bloomfield and J. C. McLean of Summerside, as deacon and sub-deacon of office; and Rev. P. P. Arsenault as master of ceremonies.

After Communion Rev. F. X. Gallant preached an eloquent and forcible sermon, dwelling especially on the origin of the title and feast of Notre Dame du Mont Carmel. The Mass ended the procession formed and took its position around the monument in front of the church, when His Lordship unveiled and blessed the statue while the clergy and the choir sang the Ave Maris Stella and the Magnificat.

In short these two days will mark an epoch, and occupy a cherished page in the history of this parish, and the monument will bear witness to future generations of the faith and devotion of the Acadians to the Blessed Virgin, and a happy souvenir of the opening of the twentieth Century.—COM.

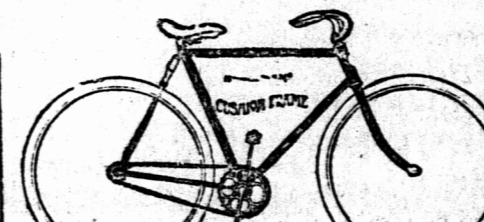

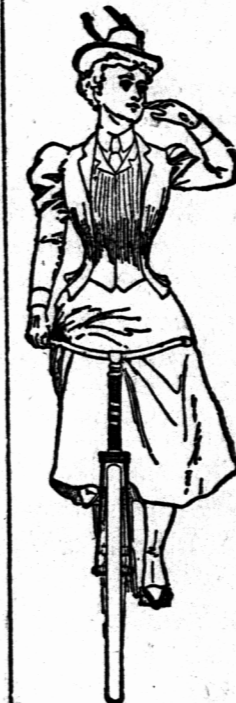
