Captain The Hon. James Frederick Cumming-Bruce, of the Black Watch, who fell on the field of Magersfontein, was the eldest son of Lord Thurlow, and, on his

Earl of Elgin, who was Governor-General of Canada at the time the Houses of Parliament were burned in Montreal, in 1849.

The deceased officer was born at The Hague, in 1867, was educated at Eton, and at Sandhurst, and received his commission in the Black Watch in 1885. He took his Captaincy in 1893, and passed the Staff College in 1897. Nine years ago Captain Cumming-Bruce married Cecily, daughter of the late Mr. L. H. Clifton, of Lytham Hall, Lancashire. Captain Cumming-Bruce was removed to the hospital at Wynberg, where he died a few days after the battle which cost his regiment so dear.

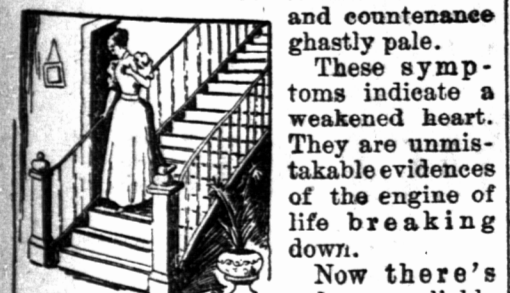
