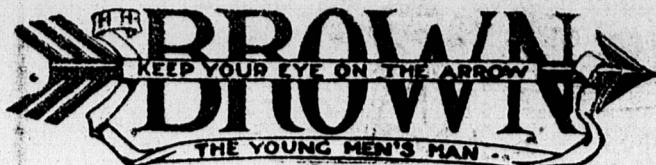

GRAIN GROWERS TALK AND DISPLAY TEMPER.

REGINA, Sask., Feb. 15—The Reciprocity Pact was endorsed by the delegates to the Grain Growers Association in convention yesterday morning. In fact the whole platform of the farmers Ottawa delegation was reindorsed intact, after a brief, but enthusiastic discussion.

President Maharg read the platform in full to the convention. The gathering was not orderly, as at previous sessions. President Maharg had hard work to maintain order.

R. M. Douglas, Strassburg, provided the only sensation of the morning. He denounced the grain growers

roundly for not supporting independent candidates in the recent federal elections. There was talk in plenty about getting the proper representation in parliament, he said, yet when the time came the farmers were not behind the men.

Resolutions endorsing the system of elevators at central points, with terminal facilities under government ownership; Canadian terminal elevators; a continuation of the clause of the Grain Act which the Association desires; the credit of the province to be used for farm loans at the lowest possible interest; the construction of the Hudson Bay Railway, and the equalization of freight rates were adopted.

THE GRAND TRUNK FORGES AHEAD.

The blast of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway contractors is echoing against the rocky walls of Tete Jaune Cache to make way for cultivation and the shrill echoes of the locomotive whistle later on.

Going Westward from Edmonton along the Grand Trunk Pacific route the traveller sees the trail of the second comer already strongly marked, and Tete Jaune Cache is the objective point at present for the end of steel by the spring of 1912. At present the Grand Trunk Pacific steel is beyond the Great Divide and over the summit of the Yellowhead Pass.

Historically, Tete Jaune is a centre of interest in Western Canada, as this point was the site of one of the Hudson Bay posts one hundred years ago, when the route from the Peace and the Fraser Rivers brought the furs and the merchandise through this gateway. At the present time there is only a band of Shuswap Indians camped on the South side of the Fraser, and as soon as the steel reaches this locality
