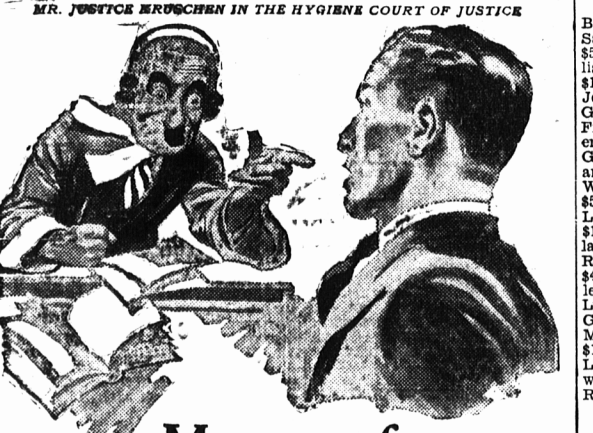

Mushrooms, Rye Set Record Growth 1938

Mrs. A. K. McNeill, Fort Qu'Appelle, Sask., in writing says that they are living in a new world in Saskatchewan just now, beautiful showers and sunshine, the growth is enormous, even the fox pups are growing faster this year. The following clipping from the Regina Leader-Post will give a good idea of the growth: Mushrooms and rye—The mushrooms (photographed) came from Flintoft, Sask., and weighed two pounds, and the rye—on the stalks—same from Caron, Sask., and stood six feet, three inches tall.

They were examples of Saskatchewan's 1938 growth. Nicholas R. Adamache, a farmer of the Flintoft area, southwest of Assiniboia, picked the mushroom which was three and a half inches thick and 11 inches in diameter. The straw of fall rye was grown on the farm of C. F. Colenut, of Caron, and it measured six feet three inches high with heads that averaged more than four inches in length. The straw was strong and heads were filling well. Mushrooms are sprouting all over the province and travellers tell of delicious menus prepared at

country hotels. Even in some Regina gardens housewives are finding mushrooms every reported place, about five years ago. It was considerably bigger than the Flintoft specimen. Generally, everything is growing this year. Vegetation in Regina and surrounding district is the best in the memory of most people. Frosty sight is a field divided by beets at Regina jail. When viewed from a slight elevation on the Boggy Creek road the field appears like an English meadow. The growth at Boggy Creek park, particularly a clump of trees south of the golf course, has been remarkable. Wild flowers are growing in profusion in some parts of the country. Several varieties can be found along what is known as the "middle road" to Moose Jaw. City parks promise to be beauty spots when flower beds bloom, but the dying lilacs and even now the honeysuckles give touches of a new cool to the parks.
