LONDON, March 10.—A jubilant shout of "four!" was raised by a great throng of financial men jamming the streets in the neighborhood of the Bank of England when it was announced today that the bank rate had been reduced from five to four percent.

HOLE

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that in future civic elections a Voters' List shall be prepared by the Clerk of the Stipendiary Magistrate, the said Clerk to be styled "Electoral Officer." The Voters' List when signed and certified to by the Electoral Officer shall be accepted by the Returning Officer and his deputies, etc., "as the only conclusive evidence of those whose names are on the lists as having the right to vote at the ensuing civic election."

Part Time Assessor

Section 42, dealing with the Assessor's term of office, provides, in the existing statute, that the Assessor shall devote "all his time to the duties of the office and such other civic duties as may be assigned to him and shall not engage in any trade, occupation, or business on his own account," etc.

No Yearly Assessment

Section 51 is amended by adding a sub-section (3) providing that it shall not be necessary for the Assessor to make up each year a new Assessment Book, but the book shall be kept by the Assessor as a permanent record for assessment purposes, to be added to each year by the assessor making out a supplementary return of the locations and valuations of the properties or poll tax of all persons, firms or corporations liable to be assessed who are not on the permanent assessment book.

Taxes Due July 1st.

Section 78 of the existing statute provides that taxes shall be due and payable on the first day of August in each year. The amendment changes the date to the first day of July.

Tax Discounts

Section 83 of the existing statute, governing tax discounts, is replaced in the amendment by the following section: "83. It shall be lawful for the City Council to allow a discount rate not exceeding the scale hereafter mentioned, on all assessments on real estate, personal property or income paid within each year within the time or times following, that is to say:
