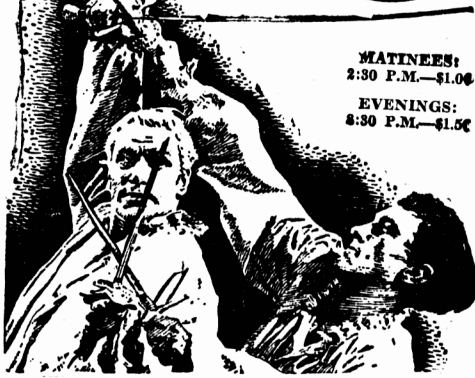

Premier McDonald Outlines Platform

HALIFAX, May 25 (CP)—Premier MacDonald said in a statement tonight that if his Liberal Government is returned to power in the June 9 provincial election it will proceed with highways and public works expenditures totalling \$100,000,000 during the next five years.

The Premier earlier had given a keynote speech in the election campaign at Kentville and tonight's statement covered much of the same ground as he had gone over at that time.

Other highlights of the platform: 1. Public works, now a \$5,000,000 business annually, probably will become a separate department to enable highway officials to give their entire time to purely road transport problems.

2. Early appointment of an education minister and further expansion of land settlement activities. 3. Revision of the common school curriculum, improved teacher training, improved normal college facilities, \$1,000,000 in grants to cities and towns desiring to build modern high schools and five more rural high schools in addition to the four built recently or now under construction.

4. New buildings and expansion of old facilities at the Victoria General Hospital, Nova Scotia Hospital, Nova Scotia Sanatorium, Nova Scotia Training School, branch laboratories where required throughout the Province and appropriate staff expansions to "make these developments effective."

5. Free medical care for all pensioners and mothers allowance beneficiaries and financial assistance for the Maritime School for Social Work. 6. "Special stress" on work of

the housing commission. 7. Hard surfacing of highways will continue at about 100 miles a year. Secondary roads will be improved. 8. Financial aid for the Canso and Halifax-Dartmouth bridges; 40,000 acres of marshlands will be reclaimed; the Nova Scotia Agricultural College rebuilt; a \$4,000,000 fund will back the government's search for new industries; \$740,000 annual assistance to municipalities.

The 3,000-word platform outlined the Liberal record since 1933 and a detailed program of what the government proposed if re-elected.
