

### 'Help Wanted' Advertisements

Under the new government regulations which became effective on September 4, it is still permissible to publish over an advertiser's own name "Help Wanted" advertisements for domestics; farm help; teachers; nurses and probationers; fishing and trapping help, and for students employed after school.

All other "Help Wanted" advertisements, however, must be submitted by the advertiser to the National Selective Service Officer, Unemployment Insurance Commission, I. O. F. Hall, Richmond Street, and on receiving the officer's approval the advertisements can then be inserted in The Charlottetown Guardian.
