The ice in the S'ide harbor is getting very thin, the opening at head of Railway Wharf is enlarging rapidly, while the rest of the channel, the ice varies in thickness from four to thirteen inches. There is not the usual ice at the mouth of the harbor, and the open water shows on some days, within about a half mile of the light-house. All the mud-diggers with the exception of two, were brought ashore some days ago.
