**WHAT THE AMEER IS DOING.**

LONDON, July 20.—No effort is apparently being made by the Ameer's officials to stop the Tagao Mullah, and even supposing that the Ameer is now anxious to prevent further complications, he is likely to find great difficulty in asserting his authority, as the Mullahs have excited popular feeling, which is more easily roused than laid. The Ameer's conduct throughout has been rather puzzling. No attempts of any kind have seemingly been made to check the Bahhan excursions into the Mohmand country. Another serious feature is that the tribal levies appear to have been provided with supplies and ammunition on something like an organized system, showing that the leaders are confident of keeping their men together. The only official news of developments in the Mohmand situation has plans having crossed the Kahl river, reference to reports of bands of Afghans having crossed the Kahl river, that in any case it is unfair to hold the Ameer responsible for their movements. This, it is pointed out, was only what was to be expected. These so-called "Afghans" are not regular soldiers and Shikaris—nomad Afghans, it is true, but tribesmen over whom the Ameer has only the most shadowy form of control. These people are always to be found where there is any likelihood of trouble. As a matter of fact, a band of this same class crossed into the Zakkia Khel country at the time of the last operations, but too late to affect the situation, as they found that peace had been concluded. In well-informed quarters it is felt that the presence of this band does not complicate the situation, and General Willcocks is the general officer commanding, with Brigadier General C. Anderson, Major-General A. Barrett, and Brigadier General J. G. Ramsay commanding the three brigades. Colonel Dick commands the line of communication. With General Willcocks is Major Ross Keppel, known to his familiar as "The King of the Khyber," whose knowledge of the frontier is surpassed only by his daring and his sense of duty. The general's operation of India by the Afghan leader is an aftermath of the Zakkia Khel uprising a few months ago, when the British were driven out of the region. **TRADE SHOWS A FALLING OFF**

OTTAWA, July 20.—The total trade of Canada for the first quarter of the present fiscal year was \$114,870,967, a decrease of \$35,299,622, as compared with the corresponding period of last year. The imports totalled \$38,221,197, a decrease of \$29,825,005. The exports totalled \$76,649,860, a decrease of \$6,474,617. During the month of June, the decrease in imports was \$8,808,771 and the decrease in exports was \$1,241,539. The Customs revenue from the three months, was \$19,638,298, a decrease of \$7,231,965. The monthly reports from now on will, it is expected, show a gradual betterment, consequent upon the lessening of the effects on trade of the business depression of the winter and spring months.

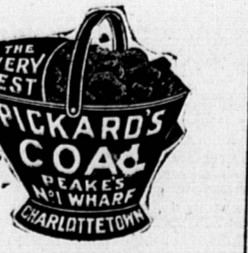
The following was the composition of the field force for the frontier operations.  
First Brigade: 1st Battalion influence with the Pathans, Northumberland Fusiliers, 52nd Sikhs, 57th (Wilde's) and 69th (Scotch) Rifles, A. and B. sections of No. 1 British Field Hospital, and No. 101 Native Field Hospital.  
Second Brigade: Somerset Highlanders, the Infantry of the Queen's Own Corps of Guides, the 20th Punjab, the 55th Sikhs, sections C. and D. of No. 1 British Field Hospital, and No. 102 Native Field Hospital.  
Third Brigade remains at Peshawar, and will be composed of the Royal Munster Fusiliers, the 20th and 22nd Punjab, the 40th Pathans, sections of No. 7 British Field Hospital and No. 112 and 113 Native Field Hospitals. There will be available supply columns with each brigade.  
The divisional troops consist of the 21st Native Cavalry, the 4th Mountain Battery Royal Artillery, the 24th and 29th Mountain Batteries, Indian Army, Sappers, Nos. 1 and 2 companies, the 34th Sikhs, and No. 103 Native Field Hospital.

**LONDON'S DOCK RAT WAR.**

LONDON, July 20.—The campaign to exterminate the 54,000 rats which it is estimated infest the London and India docks began in earnest the other night. Nearly a thousand "baits," cunningly laid in "traps" through which the rats travel from one shed to another on their work of destruction, were placed in position during the evening. They consisted of little packets of apparently harmless potato. But in each lay the germ of a contagious disease, which, although ineffective in the case of all animals, seizes the rat in the grip of a wasting disease from which it cannot recover. Early next morning, when an inspection of the sheds was made, it was found that every "bait" had been eaten. This means that at least one thousand rats will have died from the disease in the course of the next seven days; and, further, these one thousand rats are likely to spread the infection among at least two or three times their number, so that the death roll may be expected to be pretty heavy.

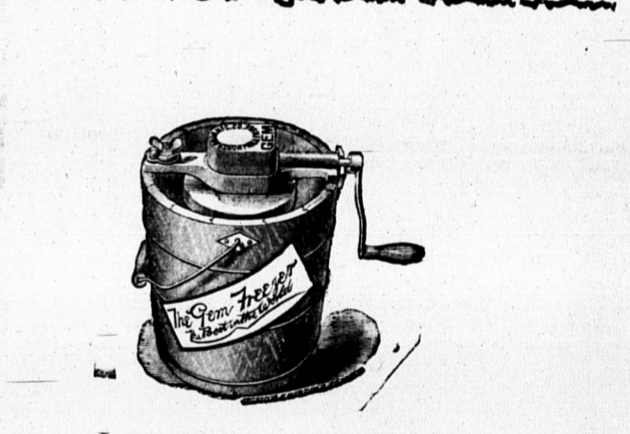
