

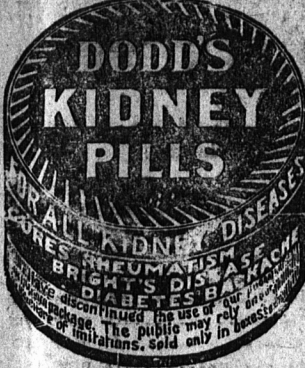

COOK BURNED TO DEATH IN A BIG HOTEL FIRE

New London, Conn., Jan. 1.—Embarraco store and a barber shop on the ground floor. The fire started in the tobacco store, and the smoke penetrating to the apartments above aroused the occupants, all of whom hurriedly left the building with the exception of Miss Durrand and Miss Pierson. While these two were waiting to raise a ladder the gasoline tank exploded and Miss Pierson was thrown to the street by the shock. Miss Durrand disappeared from view at the same time and her body was later found in the ruins.

New York, Jan. 1.—Discouraged and despondent because her husband had lost employment, Mrs. John F. Ford, a bride of six weeks, ended her life by drinking carbolic acid. When the couple were married Ford had a position as salesman in a New York store, but he was laid off a week before Christmas and has been unable to obtain employment ever since that time.

DUKE OF DEVONSHIRE IN BRITISH CAMPAIGN

LONDON, Jan. 1.—The Duke of Devonshire, Liberal Unionist, has issued an important election manifesto in which he virtually advises the free trade Unionists to support the Liberal candidates, rather than the protectionist Unionist. By treating the Home Rule question as a mere side issue, he deals the strongest blow to Mr. Balfour's election tactics. The Duke asserts that there is no indication that the opinion of the country has changed since the rejection of the last Home Rule Bill, and that it is in the highest degree improbable that the Government of Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman will incur the risk of introducing another such measure in the next Parliament. Therefore, he says, the question of Free Trade must be the paramount factor in the coming elections, and declares that there must be no deviation from attachment to free trade. The Duke confesses that he knows no more now than when he left the late Government of what is implied by the Balfourian fiscal scheme, which its authors and protectionists alike, on the other hand, he says there is no ambiguity about the Chamberlain propaganda which is avowedly protectionist. The manifesto concludes that the Unionist party organization has largely been captured by the protectionist wing, and that should the party become predominantly protectionist, there will either be real danger to free
