

# Kinsmen Come From Behind To Defeat Reece Squad 5-3

Ev. MacNeill's fighting band of Kinsmen Juniors last night defeated the Reece Juniors at Memorial Field by a score of 5-3 and thereby went into a deadlock with the losers for the league lead in the junior circuit.

Fighting back from a 3-0 lead the winners tallied once in the second and scored two runs in the fifth, and sixth innings while their hurler Garth Crockett was blanking the losers on three hits from the second inning on. Earl Dorish on the mound for the Reece pitched a good brand of ball allowing the winners only six hits while he sent eight batters back to the dugout via the strikeout route. Crockett struck out five batters.

The Reece went into an early lead in the first two innings as they scored three times but their final tally was the single for an all out drive by the Kinsmen that was to take them into a first place tie for the league lead.

The only batter to garner more than one hit during the fray was Charlie Kennedy, the winner's second sacker as he accounted for two safe blows. Howatt of the losers walloped a home run into left field while Lewis and Rossiter of the Kinsmen hit triples with Lewis being called out at the plate as he tried to stretch his blow into a four-bagger.

## 60 Competitors Taking Part In P. R. A. Shoot

The 75 annual meeting of the Provincial Rifle Meeting Association got underway yesterday morning at 8 o'clock with upwards of 80 competitors attending.

The overcast skies threatened rain but disappeared about 9 a.m. and a fine, warm day made high scores possible. It was one of the most exciting shoots in many years with some of the younger shots showing up remarkably well.

Winner of two matches was Capt. A.J. McCabe with a first in the Moore and McLeod match and a first in the Cameron-Vincombe match. Trooper Alvin McDonald won the DeBlois Bros. Ltd match after a shoot off with three other marksmen with identical scores. Trooper McDonald was also one of the two highest in the Prowse Bros. Ltd. match, sharing honours with Sgt. Eric Coles of Milton. They will shoot off together for possession of the H.M.C.S. Queen Charlotte trophy.

The first match to get underway was the DeBlois Bros. Ltd. match with ten shots at 200 yards. Four riflemen made 49's and the shoot off for the No. 5 Divisionals Signals Cup was won by Trooper Alvin McDonald. Top tyro in this match was Pte. R.A. Vessey of the York Rifle Club and Cadet Lieutenant W. Davey was the winner of the Service Rifle Class.

The Prowse Bros. Ltd. match, 10 shots at 200 yards, produced some high scores with Trooper Alvin McDonald coming through with a 49 out of a possible 50. Sgt. Eric Coles had an identical score and the pair of marksmen will shoot off at noon today for the Queen Charlotte Cup.

Capt. R.A. Vessey led the tyro and Cadet A.W. Davey was in front in the Service Rifle Class. Capt. A.J. McCabe was the winner of the Moore and McLeod match fired at 500 yards. Capt. McCabe scored a possible 50 points and in addition to his first prize also won the Reece Regiment Cup. Leading tyro was Trooper E. Landrigan of the 117th Recce with a score of 72 while Cadet Lieutenant W. Davey of the R.C.N. Reserve led the Service Rifle Class with a total score of 40.

Capt. A.J. McCabe chalked up his second victory of the day when he led a big field in the Cameron-Vincombe match. Capt. McCabe's 49 out of a possible 50 in addition to winning first prize money also receives the Cameron-Vincombe Trophy.

Runner-up was Miss Mary McLellan with a total of 48 points. Leading tyro was Sgt. A.M. Horne and Cadet Lieut. W. Davey again led the Service Rifle Class. Among those taking part in the matches was Sgt. Major W.A. Larter of British Columbia who was
