COMMERCIAL CRUISERS ON CANADA FAST LINE

A London correspondent under date of June 18th referring to the discussion in England on the proposed Canadian fast line says: The newspapers seem to vie with each other in their efforts to keep the Canada fast line before the public.

There seems to be no doubt that the project will be in part an enterprise with which the C. P. R. will be intimately connected. The terminal port in Canada will be Sydney, while on this side Milford Haven and Swansea are making claims for consideration.

This is no new principle; what is new is the character of the ships, which it is intended should be at the disposal of the Admiralty. The case of the promoters of this line is that they are building a quite new type of vessel—a cruiser carrying heavy guns, with great speed and efficient either for offence or defence. These vessels, with the armament of 6 inch and 4.7-inch guns, and with their protected decks, will be practically as formidable as most of the cruisers in the navy.

THE COST VERY HEAVY. The cost of the construction of ships of this character must be enormously greater than that of any passenger or mail boats previously constructed.

The Navaho, formerly owned by Royal Phelps Carroll, New York Yacht Club was second and Emperor William's American built yacht Meteor finished third.

He thinks the Sydney proposal not feasible. As for passengers going out to land so far east of the commercial centres of Canada, no man, even one favorable to such a line, would claim that the American and Canadian tourist traveller would take this proposed fast route.

As regards steamships, the Germans, he thinks, so far have the call. The miles run and the knots per hour show exactly what can be done in the way of fast travelling.
