H. L. CHNEE MARRIAGE NULL

TORONTO, July 1.—The court of appeal has given a decision affirming the judgment by Judge Winchester, whereby it was declared that marriages celebrated by the Rev. Hooper Brown, of the Chinese church, Toronto, were illegal. It was held that the Chinese church was not a church within the meaning of the law, and that Brown had not shown that he had been ordained according to the rites and ceremonies of any church known to the law. The case arose out of the marriage of a white girl to a Chinaman performed by Brown over a year ago.

SARDINES ADDED TO THEIR OUTPUT

DIGBY, July 1.—The firm of A. Boutiller and company, of Centreville, Digby, who were the pioneers in the kippered herring trade of Nova Scotia, have recently increased the capacity of their plant and will add sardines to the lines of fish in future put up.

The firm have carried on private investigations with a view to bringing their brands of prepared fish up to the Scotch standard, and their output, now largely placed in the American markets, commands prices equal to those paid for the best Scotch cure, the methods employed being largely identical.

Two power presses purchased in Aberdeen, Scotland, have recently been installed, by which the sheets used are pressed from the sheet tin in one piece, and the entire plant in its appointments is of the most approved type. The company affords employment to a large number of hands.
