ANTI-CIGARETTE BILL IN ENGLAND

Measure Introduced In House Of Commons to Stop Children Smoking

LONDON, Feb. 18—A bill, which passed its first reading in the House of Commons yesterday afternoon, becomes law, juvenile lovers of cigarettes will have a hard time in indulging their appetite. The act prohibits smoking under the age of sixteen, provides penalties for anyone less than sixteen years old caught smoking in the streets, or any other public places, and makes the sale of cigarettes to persons under sixteen years a punishable offence.

FURTHER COMMENT ON MAIL ORDERS

Another Letter On This Interesting Subject—Approves Of The Guardian

SIR:—In your editorial of the 14th inst., I think you have hit the nail on the head, and I consider that your view of the case is the proper one. I honestly believe that the credit system of doing business, is, to a great extent, responsible for the present condition of things, for a customer, buying goods on credit, must certainly pay more for them, than a customer who buys for cash. In your issues of the 12th and 13th inst., there appears two articles, both signed "Farmer," the first one is so contemptible as to be worthy of little notice, but perhaps it would be well to say, in passing that the gentleman who refers to Patriotism as "the last refuge of a scoundrel," and considers the retail store "a necessary evil," would doubtless be only too ready to claim the protection of his country if necessary, or to unblushingly ask his local merchant for credit. I do not wish to be drawn into a controversy with any man along such lines, and I would ask him in future, to try and refrain from throwing mud, when he pleads his case through the medium of the P.E. Island Press.

"Farmer" number two, in his letter shows himself to be at least a gentleman, and according to his ideas is giving a fair and square view of the situation, but I think that he will admit, that were he to spend the money at home that he now sends away, he would find that he would get just as good, if not better value for his money, with the exception of a few lines such as stationery, which that the mail order stores sell at less than cost, in order to lead the people to believe that all their goods are sold on the same basis. I have myself, seen people wearing misfit garments that they bought from mail order houses, and which, if bought from their local dealer, would be returned at once and their money demanded. How many people would buy a poor fitting garment from a local merchant? Not one, and still, in the face of all that, they are sending money away for clothing, etc., with no guarantee as to the quality or fit, then I ask, would it not be better and more satisfactory, to go to a local store and make your selection from the goods themselves, rather than from a catalogue, which shows the quality, color, and texture of the article required. The mail order house is not in any better position, to sell goods cheap, than the local merchant, as any merchant having the means at his disposal, imports his goods direct, from the place of production, and sells them to the customer, for a fair living profit only. Competition is so keen at present in all our towns and villages, that it seems that the merchants are trying to see who can give the people the greater value for their money, and on the other hand, when the farmers are selling their produce, the same holds good, and the merchants vie with one another to see who can pay the highest price. Then, when our people are so well protected, in both buying and selling, by the keenest of competition, cannot we how anyone can be justified in sending abroad for their goods. Let us then, all bear in mind the fact, that the mail order business is undermining the very foundations of our legitimate trade, and, if the present sense is followed, the injury now being done to the merchants, will, in the very near future, make itself generally felt. Hoping that you Mr. Editor, will continue to give us the benefit of your valued experience, and that you will keep this important matter before the public, through the columns of your widely circulated paper, I am,
