ON Tuesday evening Mr. Alex. McKay had wood Hill, Pictou County, N. S. arrived in the city by the Princess with the beautiful Hackney stallion Kilwick Fireway and is now to be found at the stables of the Revere Hotel. It will be remembered that this stallion took 1st. prize at the P. E. Island Provincial Exhibition in 1899. He descends from the most fashionable registered and purest Hackney blood in England, and having all the meritorious points of the breed, such as a strong robust constitution, full of energy and vigor, a beautifully formed head, finely arched neck, set on strong and nicely sloping shoulders, grand back and loins, nicely sprung rib, wonderfully strong quarters, arm large and quite in proportion to his shoulders, thighs remarkably well muscled, legs perfectly clean and flat with knees and hocks that are absolutely faultless, a fine springy pastern of proportionate length and perfect feet. In color he is a dark bay, with black legs mane and tail. His size entitles him to rank in this respect as first class. His action is perfection. He is a very high, clean stepper, with very showy knee and hock action. His breeding is such that he will undoubtedly transmit his superior qualities to his offspring, having an ancestry of thirteen generations in a direct line in the English Hackney Stud Book. Mr. McKay will be guided entirely by the manner in which breeders appreciate his enterprise in coming to Charlottetown. It will be remembered that a buyer of horses who recently visited this city strongly advocated the introduction of Hackney horses.

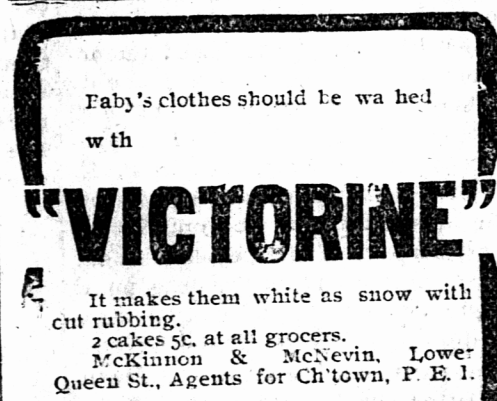
