Monthly Meeting Of Summerside Town Council

A number of matters were discussed at the regular meeting of the Summerside Town Council held last evening with His Worship Mayor J. F. Arnett presiding and all the members of the Council present.

In opening the meeting Mayor Arnett said he was glad to be back again after his illness and he spoke with appreciation of the matter in which the Council and the officials had carried on during his absence.

Councillor Henry Wedge welcomed the Mayor back and said that he hoped his health would continue to improve.

Discuss Labor Rate. A request was read asking for an increase in the rate of pay for the laborers from 50 cents an hour to 65 and for truckmen from 70 to 85 cents.

The Clerk informed the meeting that the rates in Charlottetown were 45 cents for laborers and 50 cents for truckmen.

Councillor Wedge stated that he was of the opinion that the Council should pay a rate as high as that paid for such work in the Province and he moved that the matter be referred to be considered after information has been obtained as to the rates paid by companies hiring labor. The motion was seconded by Councillor J. L. Gorrill and passed.

Protest Read. A protest was read from a number of taxpayers and firms located near the Tantion property on Water Street West protesting against the Town giving permission to the Irving Oil Co. to erect a bulk storage tank on the waterfront. The letter gave a number of reasons for their objections. It stated that there would be an odor and that it would create a fire hazard and cause the value of nearby property to depreciate. It also stated that there would be an oil scum on the water spilling from the tanks and causing bathing and swimming there.

Ltd., Harold Lyle, Ethel Sudbury, Summerside Hardware Co., Mrs. Euphemia Basler, Brenton MacLean, J. F. Taylor, Earle Schurman, Clifton Hotel, Thomas Perry George Guergis.

The Clerk also read a reply from Mr. D. O. Stewart representing the Irving Oil Co. Ltd., which said that there would be no odor and it would cause no depreciation. The plans would be passed by the Fire Marshall, the letter said, and pointed out that in other places no oil scum was caused and that 75 per cent of oil storage tanks are erected within the limits of municipalities.

Mayor Arnett said that Mr. Irving had been in Summerside and the situation had been explained to him. The Mayor said he felt that the Council could not go against the wishes of the taxpayers.

Councillor Morrison said that if the Government had purchased the line to Mount Pleasant Airport, Youth Centre Inc. is intending to fold up and is blaming the Council. He said he thought if they had the right man as Welfare Officer the Council would continue their grant. He thought that they should carry on as it was the answer to the problem and he personally would do all he could to help. Councillor Wedge brought up the matter of the milk test which is now apparently done in a different way than formerly and nobody seems to understand it. It was decided to take the matter up with the Department of Health.
