

SALARIES OF BAPTIST MINISTERS TOO LOW

BRIDGETOWN, Aug. 21—A large attendance was on hand at the opening of the business session of the Baptist convention this morning.

Rev. Professor Gilmour, of McMaster University, Toronto, was introduced and addressed the convention.

Rev. Edwin Crowell, D.D., reported for the committee on union with the Disciples. This committee affirmed the policy of co-operation on home mission fields and through interchange of fraternal delegates be continued.

The committee on minimum pastors' salaries reported through E. M. Sipprell, of St. John. The committee endorsed the principle of the proposition of Rev. J. W. Brown, Ph.D., that an effort be made to increase pastors' salaries to a minimum of \$800 and parsonage.

THE PLAN PROPOSED BY REV. DR. BROWN. Dr. Brown then presented his plan. He had examined the salaries of 216 pastors in the convention. The average salary of Baptist ministers is \$699.31.

One hundred and forty-six pastors receive less than \$500 salary; 47 pastors receive \$1,000; over 70 receive \$800 or over. It will require \$25,800 to bring up all pastors' salaries to \$800.

Dr. Brown proposed that the entire membership of the Baptist churches raise at least twenty cents per member to create a fund to supplement all salaries now below the minimum.

All churches receiving aid from this fund are to raise not less than \$500 and free house. The treasurers of denominational funds are to be the custodians of this supplemental fund, one individual in each association to be responsible for bringing this subject before each church in the denomination.

THE DENOMINATION URGED TO RISE TO ITS RESPONSIBILITIES. Dr. Brown eloquently urged that the denomination rise to the full obligation of their responsibility.

Dr. Brown's proposition was seconded by the Rev. A. Graham Barton, of Springhill, who added valuable methods being worked in England to increase pastors' salaries.

THE STIGMA OF SMALL SALARIES. The nominating committee reported as follows:—Preacher of convention alternate Rev. E. Daley. The various standing committees for the year were named by the nominating committee.

Rev. F. W. Patterson, of Edmonton, representing the Baptist convention of western Canada, was introduced.

THE REPORT ON WOLFVILLE INSTITUTIONS. I. B. Oakes, secretary, reported the attendance at the schools at Wolfville as the largest in years and the number of teachers at work exceeded those of any former year.

The college registration was 250, with 35 graduates. The report specially noted the great development of the library and museums during the year.

The library is open 6 hours each day with daily attendance of 150 readers. 2,088 volumes have been added to the library since September, 1910. There are now 16,000 volumes in the library.

"Already aeroplanes are being constructed of steel. I have seen the course of construction of machines of this metal in France. The 1,000 feet aeroplanes for ocean travel will be of that material and will have engines of 75,000 horse power. The aeroplanes for use in war will not necessarily be of that length of the passenger machines. I believe the war air craft will be nearer 200 feet in length."
